EXPERT TALK ON - ROLE OF POLICE IN THE ADMINISTRATION

An expert talk was organised on 2nd December 2017. Shri V.V. LAKSHMINARAYANA 9 (Additional DGP, Maharashtra Police) addressed the law students about the **ROLE OF POLICE IN ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE** .

The key points that he addressed were -

The role of the police in the administration of justice in India is crucial and multifaceted. The police force in India is primarily responsible for maintaining law and order, preventing and detecting crimes, and investigating and apprehending offenders. Here are some key aspects of their role:

Crime Prevention: The police play a vital role in preventing crime by maintaining a visible presence in communities, conducting regular patrols, and implementing preventive measures. They aim to deter potential offenders and create a sense of security among the public.

It's important to note that the administration of justice in India involves multiple agencies and institutions, including the police, judiciary, prosecution, and corrections. Each of these entities



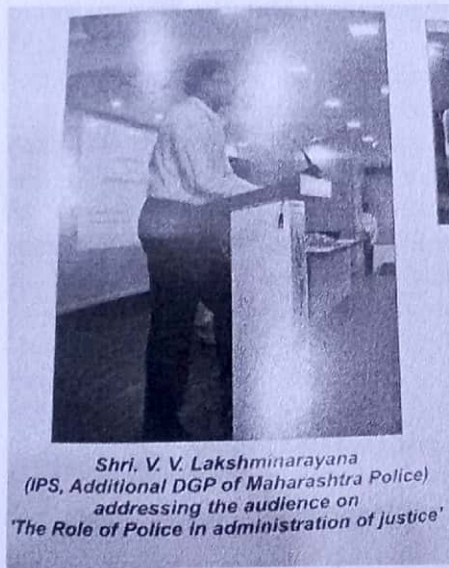
has distinct roles and responsibilities that collectively contribute to the administration of justice.



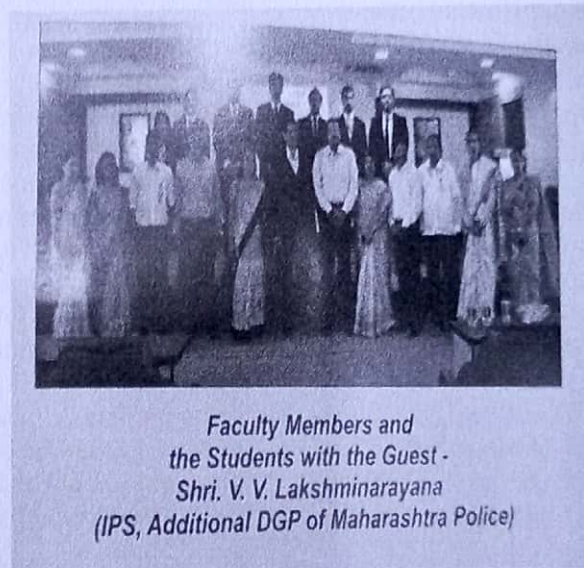

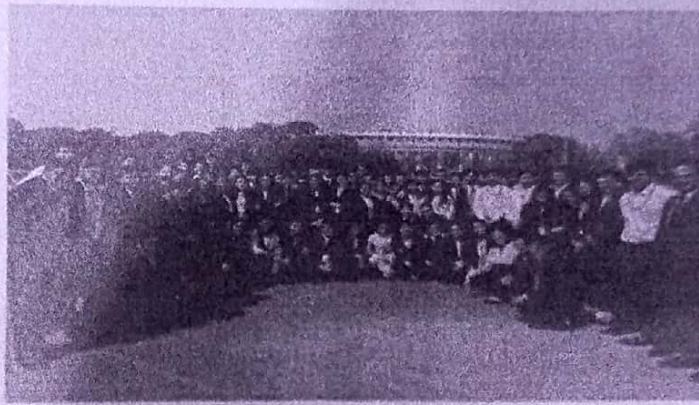
Keeping in view with the above mentioned criteria , VES COLLEGE OF LAW conducts academic tour for its students .

The last leg of the trip included a visit to Nainital and Jim Corbett.**

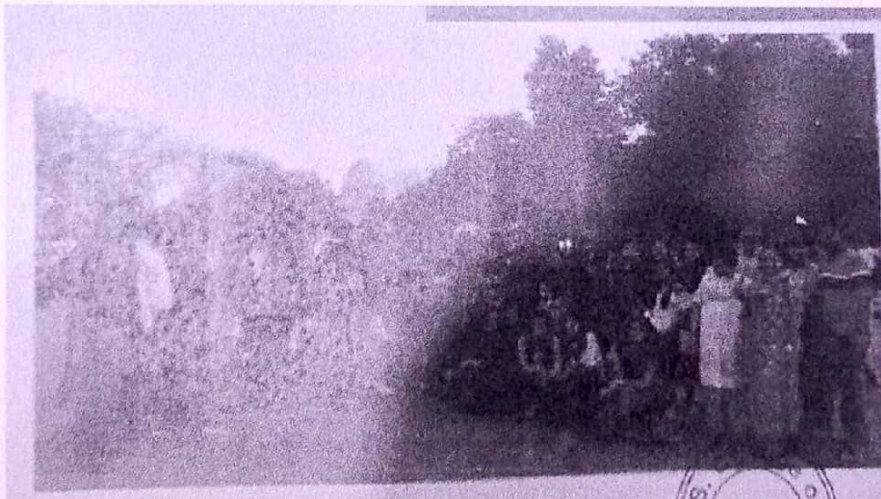




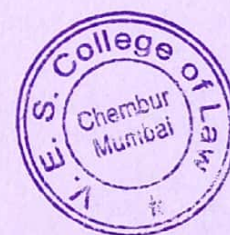

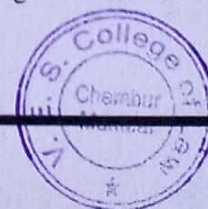
STATE LEVEL SEMINAR ON CHILDS RIGHTS -

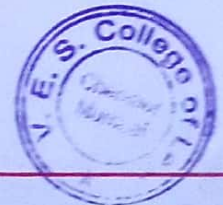
Women Development Cell (WDC)




