Report of Placement Cell Recruitment Drive 2021-22

1. Placement Cell of 2021-22 planned a recruitment drive and contacted a number of firms that earlier recruited our students with whom the cell established a good communication through the coordinators.
2. However, the cell did not receive a positive responses from the employers. Some of the reasons to such responses were time constraint and on campus recruitment. The firms that were contacted are mentioned below:
 - a) **AAA Insolvency, Navi Mumbai:** Contacted for the recruitment drive, currently they do not have any vacancy for the post of an associate and are not in need of law graduates/final year law students.
 - b) **Adv. Rachana Agrawal, Sion:** The advocate was also contacted for recruitment drive. Multiple calls were made but she was not answering the calls and hence was unreachable.
 - c) **HNT Legal:** The firm was contacted however, the cell got no response as the employer did not receive the calls.
 - d) **Lloyd & Johnson:** Adv. Biju Johnson was contacted by the cell. He was interested in recruiting students earlier, however, his firm needed expertise on admiralty/maritime laws and thus the offer was turned down.

➤ Way forward:

- The drive should be planned in the first half of the cell formation.
- A layout should be prepared by the cell in coordination with all the members, coordinators, heads, and faculties' in-charge.
- The drive should be presented to the college and the college should pitch in for the recruitment since it is the beginning of V.E.S Placement Cell and so it creates a better impact on the recruiter.
- The training and workshops given to the students by the cell are to be presented to the employers.
- The advocates attending the events of the college shall be pitched in to recruit a number of students in the final year.
- The execution of placement drive shall begin in the second half of the year.

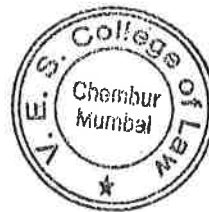

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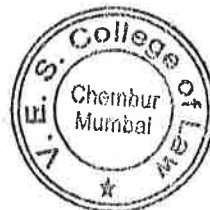
V. PROCEDURE ESTABLISHED BY THE CELL FOR ITS FUNCTIONING

1. In the first half, a form was circulated for the students of the college to fill in and get updates and opportunities through the cell. With a promising response of 160 plus students from all classes, a system was implemented where according to the interest mentioned by students and other eligibility criteria, they were given a call if an opportunity in that respect came in. Their CV would then be checked and changes would be suggested if any. The candidates would then be asked to mail their CVs to the employer.
2. This worked fairly well in the first half and , in the second half a fresh form was issued for the same purpose , it garnered 120 plus responses. However, the responses started getting less interaction from students. So, the cell changed its pattern and implemented a completely new response which yielded fairly great results.
3. The new system was that all opportunities of all departments were circulated in all classes and students were asked to approach the cell as per their wants. A telegram group for the same was also formed, which has around 150 members.
4. SOPs were also circulated to the coordinators and members by heads to ensure smooth working of the cell.
5. Grievance Resolution Mechanism: The cell followed the hierarchical grievance mechanism.
The members approached their respective coordinators, coordinators approached the heads and the heads reached out to faculties in case of any dispute/issues arising out of the cell.
It was also mentioned that in case of emergency, the hierarchical ladder could be skipped but the heads should be informed of the same.
6. Regular Follow ups: The cell took follow up of the students placed by it after completing a month at the internship to know of their experience in the internship. We have received some promising responses from the students who were placed by us.

VI. STRUCTURAL CHANGES

- Few members have left the cell due to personal commitments and family issues.
- Coordinator Ashish Gautam (TYBLS) left his position and the cell.
- 3 new members were introduced in the cell in the second half.

EXPERIENCE 1

The first court I visited that was city session court, Mumbai to observe a criminal matter.

On 4th March 2022 at 2pm in court room no 47 the matter was dealt with honorable Justice :- Shri Punishottam B. Tadnav. the case was relating to Dacoity. with my co-counsel.

The case I heard was 'Mohal'. Azim Abdul Salim Khan who was accused in dacoity case. It was for offence punishable under section : 324, 328, 504, 506(II) 387 of Indian Penal code. According to the state i.e the Nagpada police station (Ld. App Mrs Rangana Bakhramji) who was the respondent has been convicted for the offence of dacoity and now he is on bail in Criminal Appeal filed against the conviction -



It is also submitted that the applicant breached the condition of parole and therefore and of the applicant is released on bail. he would not available for the trial and he would tamper the previous due date of this case was 28th February 2020 as much information was not provided to gain more information I reached back to my counsel on this day of hearing the case.

The Honble Judge was in favour of providing the accused bail and thus ordered the same. after considering brief facts and also the argument made by my senior counsel that the bail to be granted with certain securities the court directed the same that the accused to be released on bail on executing PR bond of Rs 20,000/- also he shall attend concerned station between 9am to 10 am every day.



fill filing the charge-sheet he was also directed that, he shall not tamper the witnesses and evidence and he shall not leave the Jurisdiction of this court, at the end the court directs that he shall furnish his detailed address mobile numbers to the Court at the time of furnishing bail.



EXPERIENCE : 2

It was a day of hope from the very beginning that hope accelerated to the apex point when we were entering the court premises following the first step of one the most learned senior counsel of India.

As we were eagerly awaiting to enter in the court room my co-counsel prepared to wait outside and we did the same as they were following their social duties to let other finish and mean while they met their other most learned friends exchange advice and information and that raised my understanding and respect about advocacy.



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Although it was too crowded and almost impossible from my position to hear the proceeding but I sure earn some experience how court and lawyers could behave with each other.

we started our submission preserving criminal procedure section 241A of Code of Criminal procedure 1898, that we have submitted an application under the mentioned section.

That section 241A says when an accused appear or bought before the magistrate. If the magistrate considered the record and document of the case and making examination, and after give the opportunity of being heard of the accused, I consider the charges if think such charges are groundless he shall discharge the accused/ and record along so.

Therefore we disclose the charges brought by the prosecution and the concerned part as well as and also explained then that the charges are not correct.



Mr. Tanvir Mahmood, MD Hallmark Group using his power and impression created a fake company.

Therefore he by his power seduce the Sonali bank do give that false company a large amount of money. then via a fake transaction send the money to his company (Hallmark)

That the charges brought under sections 108/109/406/409/420 under penal code deals only with criminal breach of trust, we also submitted section 5 Subsection 2 of prevention of Corruption Act 1947, is applicable only on public servant, there was no charge containing the selection of the accused with the said allegation in the FIR, and we also claimed that the charge-sheet was fabricated depending upon the FIR.

And in the end we requested the learned court to order for the document that are necessary for understand charge and prayed more time.





Petitioner's case was that she was 'Hindu Mahavanshi' by caste. It came.

In the said order, the application made by petitioner for issuance of the caste certificate of her adopted son. was rejected by respondent.

In the present matter the petitioner had challenged the order passed by the Respondent No.1 and confirmed further by Respondent No.2 - Deputy District collector. Mumbai city and District caste certificate scrutiny committee, respectively.

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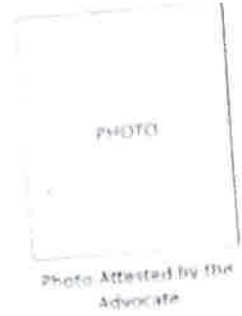

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

Facts of the case:

The Applicant in the present case is a nationalised Bank. The opposite party is a person carrying on a business as a sole proprietor. (Mr. X) Mr. X made a loan application and the Bank sanctioned cash credit facility in favour of Mr. X on the terms and conditions.

The Applicant found out that the operation in the loan Account in respect of the said credit facility became irregular and Mr. X failed and neglected to adhere by and committed several breaches

in terms of security documents and the sanction letter.

The Applicant Bank repeatedly called upon the opposite party to regularize the breaches and to make payment of the outstanding amounts due and payable.

Mr. X committed default in repaying the installment in respect of the said credit facility together with interest, costs, charges, interest etc. and is liable to pay to the Applicant Bank.

Current Status:

The Applicant filed a Mediation Application under Commercial Courts Act, 2015 to recover the loan amount.

The claim arises out of a commercial transaction and the said credit facility was granted as per the banking law and practice and customs prevalent in business.

The matter is pending before the Mediation Centre at the Bombay City Civil Court.

The PSU filed an Application before the Arbitral Tribunal to secure the costs

and claims. However, it was rejected.

The National Company Law Tribunal ordered the commencement of Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process and appointed an Interim Resolution Professional (RP) because the PSU being the Respondent had filed an Interlocutory Application.

However, the NCLT, on the day of hearing allowed the RP and the insolvent company to withdraw their Interlocutory application on merits and adjourned the Applications filed by the PSU.

Current Status:

The learned counsel on behalf of the Respondent i.e. a Public Sector Undertaking stated the Statement of Defense and the breach of contracts were also pointed out.

The Arbitral Tribunal heard both the disputant parties and provided another date to cross examine the witnesses of each other.

INTERNSHIP EXPERIENCE

The present case was regarding execution of a will.

Facts of the case :

The Plaintiff had bequeathed the company to her daughter-in-law who is the applicant in the matter, as per the will she is entitled to succeed to her estate since the original Plaintiff is deceased.

→ Brief facts of the case :

The present matter is a Writ Petition

[Habeas Corpus] filed by the petitioner before the

Hon'ble Bombay High Court for issuing the writ of the Habeas corpus against the Respondent (wife) who was alleged to have illegal custody of her own son (Aryan Mogal) aged 2 years.

The petitioner (husband) here is an NRI, came to India for the occasion of their marriage, after which the couple shifted & permanent residence in USA (Texas). After 9 years of their marriage, they conceived a child through IVF, on insistence of the Respondent (wife) the couple came back to India for celebrating their son Aryan's 1 birthday.

However, it was at the airport where the respondent (wife) without informing the Petitioner (husband) took the child with her at her maternal house. After many attempts of calling & texting which were unanswered, the petitioner (husband) lodged an FIR missing complainant in the women cell. 2 days later Respondent's brother texted the Petitioner asking him not to contact the Respondent at all & that he had no relation with the child.



After this incident, the Petitioner got an FIR registered against the respondent for holding illegal custody of the child. Thereafter, the Respondent sent a legal notice for DV and divorce. Here since the child was with his mother no specific action was taken & so the Petitioner [the client of ours] had to approach the Advocates (stated above) to proceed with the matter.

→ Court proceedings of this case,

This is an ongoing matter in the Bombay High court which is yet to decide the custody of the minor son. However apart from this, there were many interim applications made & reliefs sought by the petitioner that allowed the petitioner to at least meet his minor son during the pendency of this matter. Arguments in favour of the petitioner were made not only on the basis of facts but also certain cases where a minor has been to the father for his/her custody.

After the layout being sanctioned, the Respondent No 9 to 19 who are the owners created several plots as per the sanctioned layout. The Petitioner and 32 others have purchased the plot of land in the sanctioned layout plan. The name of the Petitioner is mutated in the revenue record in respect of the plot of land which he has



purchased. State Government vide order dated 2.1.2004 the Tahasildar, Taluka Pindori directed the Circle Officer to deduct (i) area admeasuring 3136 sq.mtrs for road widening (ii) area admeasuring 2050 sq.mtrs for internal roads, etc and (iii) area admeasuring 1561.37 sq.mtrs for open space from the total area of Gat No. 725/2 (Part) shown in the 7/12 extract of the said gat number. Accordingly, Mutation Entry No. 3741 came to be mutated by the Circle Officer on 13.1.2004. By effecting the said mutation entry, area of other gat numbers also have been deducted as per the said layout. So far as the dispute in the present matter is concerned, Gat No 725 (Part) is the relevant. Accordingly necessary entries have been taken in the 7/12 extracts of Gat No. 725/2 (Part) and name of Grampanchayat Kabse Wani is shown in the holder column of 7/12 extract of Gat No 725/2 (Part) to the extent of area admeasuring 5186.50 for roads and others. Further the name

Grampanchayat kasbe Wani is also shown in the holder column of 7112 extract of Govt No. 72512 (Part) to the extent of area admeasuring 5186.50 for open space purpose. After lapse of 11 years, Respondent Nos 9 to 19 herein filed RTs Appeal No 138 of 2015 u/s 247 of the Maharashtra Land Revenue Code before the Sub - Divisional Officer, Sub-Division, Dindori and challenged the Order dated

2.1.2004 of the Tahasildar, Dindori.

The Respondent No 9 to 19 prayed that area admeasuring 3136 sq. mtrs is in their possession and they are the owners of the said area and therefore the said area should not be mutated in name of Grampanchayat kasbe Wani and therefore revenue record be updated as per their prayer. The Sub-Divisional Officer, Dindori after hearing all concerned, was pleased to dismiss the appeal of the Respondent No 9 to 19 and further confirmed the Order dated 2.1.2004 of Tahasildar, Dindori. Respondent No 9 to 19



filed Second Appeal No 368 of 2016 under section 247 of the Maharashtra Land Revenue Code before the Additional Collector, Nashik. After hearing both sides, the Respondent No 3 the Additional Collector, Nashik was pleased to partly allow the appeal of the Respondent No 9 to 19 and directed that Mutation Entry No 3741 C (wrongly mentioned as 3174) be rectified and separate 7/12 Extract in respect of land admeasuring 3136 sq. mtrs, which is earmarked for road widening be prepared and the names of original owners be mutated in the separate 7/12 Extract for the area admeasuring 3136 sq. mtrs. Petitioner and others filed Revision Application No 987 of 2017 under section 257 of the Maharashtra Land Revenue Code before the Additional Commissioner, Nashik Division, Nashik. Additional Commissioner, Nashik was pleased to grant the interim relief of stay to the order dated 18.11.2017 of the Additional Collector, Nashik. Respondent No. 4, the Ld. Additional Commissioner, Nashik was pleased to reject the revision application of the Petitioner and others ~~blindly~~





confirmed the order dated 18.11.2017 passed by the Respondent No. 3 Additional Collector, Nashik. Petitioner and others preferred Revision Application bearing No. RT53018/16171/Case No. 95/T-6 before the Honorable Revenue Minister, State of Maharashtra. Respondent No. 1 granted stay to the order dated 31.3.2018 passed by the Additional Commissioner, Nashik in Revision Application No 987 of 2017 till the disposal of the Revision Application bearing No. RT53018/16171/Case No. 95/T-6 before the Honorable Revenue Minister, State of Maharashtra. Honorable Revenue Minister vide order dated 2.7.2021 was pleased to reject the revision application and confirmed the order dated 31.3.2018 passed by the Additional Commissioner, Nashik Division. This case in particular was a tough one as many Acts had to be referred. A lot of reading was undertaken which helped in deciding whether there was encroachment committed by the other party. I personally invested my time in drafting the writ petition.

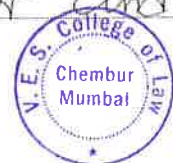

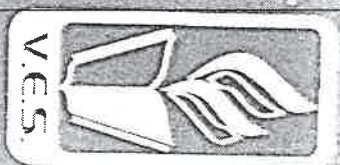



INTERNSHIP EXPERIENCES

The foregoing write ups are about the experiences which I gained during the course of my internship under Adv. Sh. Arma Raj Chandel.

Experience No. 1


The first case in which I had assisted was related to Money Laundering.

My first task was to find out the Supreme Court case where the Supreme Court had mentioned that it is compulsory to upload FIR within 24 hours from the time of lodging and the guidelines given by the Court in such case. I had searched it on SCC online and on Indian Kanoon.com about that case. The name of the case is Youth Bar Association of India Vs. Union of



India AIR 2013 SC 4136. I had given briefing of this case to my second

My Second Task was to find out more cases whose similar guidelines related to Youth Bar Association Case was given. One such case was Ajay Chaudhary V. State (2010 175 DLT 110) and I had given the briefing of same.

My Third Task was to read the cases which were referred in Ajay Chaudhary's Case. There were 3 cases whose references were given in Ajay Chaudhary's Case. First case was State of West Bengal and others Vs Committee for Protection of Democratic Rights, West Bengal and others. Second case was Lorn Mittal V. Govt of Karnataka (2008) 3 SCC 753 and third case was DK. Basu V.  of

West Bengal AIR 1997 SC 610. I had given briefing about all the three cases and my Senior told it that these three cases are relevant for us.

My fourth task was to visit the Common Cause Website and find out cases relating to the functioning of Police and transparency in the working of the Govt. I had searched the cases on Common Cause Website and came across two cases.

My fifth was to find out cases under Article 19(1)(a) and cases under RTI which can help in the Money Laundering Case.

CASE ASSISTED Experience no. 2

During the course of my internship my second case was also related to Money Laundering.

This time my first task was to read the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) Act and to find out provisions related to the Enforcement Directorate. The only section which was relevant was Section 25 which talks about the appointment of officers of Directorate of Enforcement and I had given briefing about this section to my Senior.

My second task was to read thoroughly about the Prevention of Money Laundering Act and find out relevant sections relevant to the present case. After reading the



Prevention of Money Laundering Act I came to know that there were many sections of CrPC which were applicable to Prevention of Money Laundering Act and the functioning of Police and Enforcement Directorate are similar, just they are governed by different Acts.

My third task was to read and understand the Prevention of Money Laundering (PMLA) Rules.

My fourth task was to make a report on comparison on the functioning, power and duties of Police under CrPC and Enforcement Directorate (ED) under PMLA. I had made a report on the same and submitted it to my Senior.

My fifth task was to find out how does the cases in money laundering



starts i.e. how does ED come to know about money laundering case. So it was Financial Intelligence Unit (FIU-ID) under Department of Revenue Government of India which collects financial intelligence about offences under Prevention of Money Laundering Act 2002.

My sixth task was to read the document and affidavit of ED provided by the Senior.



Case Assisted Experience no. 3

The third case in which I had assisted my senior was related to condoning the delay in bringing legal heirs on record.

Brief Facts of the Case-

The client was an employee of Rajasthan State Road Transport Corporation (RSRTC). Certain malpractice was done by him and on the basis of that his job was terminated.

According to the Industrial Dispute Act he was considered as a workman and his termination order can be only confirmed by Industrial Dispute Board. But it was not done. He was terminated from his job without any opportunity of being heard.

The client had got appeal before the High Court under Article 226 while this petition was pending the workman expired on 7th May 2021 leaving behind wife, two sons and a daughter.

delay of 8 years in bringing legal heirs on record.

The second case was Perumon Bhargavathy Devaswami V. Bhargavi Amma (D) and Ors. The LRS (2008) 8 SCC 321, here the Court condoned the delay of 394 days in bringing legal heirs on record.

My second task was to find out the limitation period in bringing legal heirs on record. The limitation period as provided under Article 120 of the Limitation Act 1963 was is 90 days from the death of the plaintiff, appellant, defendant or respondent as the case may be.

The fourth case in which I had assisted my Senior was related to bail under the SC/ST Atrocities Act.

The first task which was given to me was to read the SC/ST Atrocities Act.

The second task which was given was to read Maharashtra Control of Organised Crime (MCOCA) Act and find the similarity between MCOCA Act and Atrocities Act.

The third task which was given to me was to read National Investigation Act and find out the provision which were similar to the provision of Atrocities Act.

State of UP 2021*, in this case Miss Poonam was working as a Warden in Kasturba Gandhi Vidyalaya on contractual basis and on the basis of a complaint she was terminated from her job without an opportunity of being heard. The Allahabad High Court has set aside the order passed by Committee as no opportunity was given to Miss Poonam on her part.

→ Brief facts of the case :

The present matter is a Writ Petition

[Habeas Corpus] filed by the petitioner before the

Hon'ble Bombay High Court for issuing the writ of the Habeas Corpus against the Respondent (wife) who was alledged to have illegal Custody of her own Son (Aryan Mogal) aged 2 years.

The petitioner (Husband) here is an NRI, came to India for the occasion of their marriage, after which the couple shifted & permanerly started residing in USA (Texas). After 9 years of their marriage, they conceived a child through IVF. on insistance of the Respondent (wife) the couple came back to India for celebrating their son aryan's 1 birthday.

However, it was at the airport where the respondent (wife) without informing the Petitioner (husband) took the child with her at her maternal house. After many attempts of calling & texting which were unanswered, the petitioner (husband) lodged an FIR missing complaint in the women Cell. 2 days later Respondent's brother texted the Petitioner asking him not to contact the Respondent at all & that he had no relation with the child.



After this incident, the Petitioner got an FIR registered against the respondent for holding illegal custody of the child. Thereafter, the Respondent sent a legal notice for DV and divorce. Here since the child was with his mother no specific action was taken & so the Petitioner [the client of ours] had to approach the Advocates (stated above) to proceed with the matter.

→ Court proceedings of this case.

This is an ongoing matter in the

Bombay High court which is yet to decide the custody

of the minor son. However apart from this, there

were many interim applications made & reliefs sought

by the petitioner that allowed the petitioner to attest

meet his minor son during the pendency of this

matter. Arguments in favour of the petitioner were

made not only on the basis of facts but also certain

cases where a minor has been to the father for his/her

custody.

For further supporting the matter, the



Petitioner along with the Advocates of our firm, appointed

Adv. Prabjeet Johar (Adv. SC) and specialist in health corpus cases that did leave a great impact bringing a positive impact in the matter.

→ My work & experience :

This was one of the most interesting matters that I got an opportunity to work upon. I was made to search for case laws supporting the matter, prepare interim applications to the court asking them (the court) to grant relief, allowing the petitioner to meet his son, to draft precise for bringing the matter on board, & since it was pandemic period, not physically submitting, but mailing the precise to the Registrar of Bombay High Court. I was also made a part of the conference calls with the client i.e. the petitioner (husband)

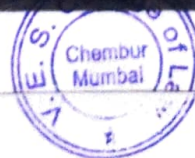
