RAIN WATER HARVESTING

Rainwater in our institution is collected from a Pit specifically installed for water harvesting where rain droplets fall. The water flows into gutters, which guide it into pipes that lead to storage tanks. Before it's stored, the water is filtered to remove leaves, twigs, dirt, and other debris, and the first bit of rainwater, which may be dirtier, is often discarded. The cleaned water is then stored in tanks for future use. This water is used for purposes like watering plants, flushing toilets, or cleaning.











• 2.2. Water Conservation:

- Harvest rainwater by setting up rainwater harvesting systems in campus utilize the collected water for gardening and non-potable uses.
