ANALYSIS OF THE CO-PO ATTAINMENT:

In most subjects, COs consistently map strongly to PO 1, which indicates that these courses are designed to give students a solid foundational understanding of legal principles. Subjects like Constitutional Law, Family Law, Law of Contract, and Labour Law show a high number of 3s in their CO-PO mapping, meaning that these subjects contribute significantly to developing a deep understanding of legal frameworks, statutory interpretations, and judicial reasoning. This reflects how these foundational courses help students comprehend the structure and operation of legal systems. Across the law courses, there is significant alignment between COs and PO 2, especially in subjects like Practical Training, Drafting, Pleading, and Conveyancing, Labour Law, and Criminal Procedure Code. The attainment here shows that the curriculum emphasizes practical legal skills and the application of legal principles to solve real-world problems. The presence of numerous 3s and 2s underlines the practical training students receive, equipping them with the ability to draft legal documents, plead cases, and provide effective legal remedies.

The attainment data shows that courses like Law of Crimes, Environmental Law, Family Law, and Human Rights strongly contribute to fostering ethical responsibilities in students. These subjects, particularly due to their social and moral context, emphasize ethical considerations and social justice in legal practice. For instance, COs in Human Rights and Environmental Law show strong links to PO 3, reflecting how students are trained to understand and apply laws that promote social equity and environmental sustainability. Critical thinking and research skills, reflected in PO 4, are integral parts of courses like Jurisprudence, Administrative Law, and Intellectual Property Laws. These subjects often require deep analysis and interpretation of complex legal concepts, and their COs reflect strong attainment in relation to PO 4. The CO-PO mapping reveals that these courses train students to critically engage with legal texts, precedents, and emerging legal issues through rigorous research.

Courses such as Legal Language and Writing, Drafting, Pleading, and Conveyancing, and Practical Training show strong correlations with PO 5. This demonstrates that these courses significantly focus on enhancing students' legal communication skills, both written and oral. The mapping suggests that through practical exercises like moots, drafting legal documents, and internships, students are honing their ability to present legal arguments, draft contracts, and interact with clients and court officials effectively. Courses related to procedural laws, such as Criminal Procedure Code, Civil Procedure Code, Law of Evidence, and Transfer of Property, are strongly aligned with PO 6. The CO-PO mapping shows that these subjects provide students with a clear understanding of legal processes, courtroom procedures, and the practical aspects of litigation. The consistent presence of 2s and 3s in these areas demonstrates that the curriculum is effective in teaching students the procedural mechanisms of the law. Advanced legal subjects like Bankruptcy Laws, Conflict of Laws, Law and Medicine, and Intellectual Property Law have high CO-PO attainments in PO 7, which focuses on specialized areas of law. These courses contribute significantly to students' ability to grasp advanced legal theories and practices. The strong mapping indicates that the curriculum offers a robust selection of electives and specialized courses that allow students to delve into niche areas of law, enhancing their expertise in specific legal fields.

The CO-PO mapping highlights that the legal curriculum is well-rounded and addresses the diverse skills and competencies required by law graduates. There is a strong emphasis on foundational legal knowledge, practical application, ethical practice, and specialized areas of law. The mapping data suggests that students are being adequately prepared for various legal careers, with a solid balance between theoretical knowledge and practical experience. Furthermore, courses focused on procedural law and legal communication show strong attainment across several POs, indicating that the program emphasizes equipping students with essential legal skills that are directly applicable in professional settings.

ANALYSIS OF THE CO-PO ATTAINMENT:






