



# **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

All first year Admissions will be made as per the guidelines issued by the University of Mumbai and the Government of Maharashtra. **Our college has minority status (Sindhi linguistic minority)** 

## FIRST YEAR ARTS

Students passing S.Y. J. C. (Std. XII) with Arts or Commerce or Science and S.Y.J.C. with vocational subjects are eligible for admission to F. Y. B. A.

Students from other states (eligibility) are required to have ENGLISH as a compulsory paper at H.S.C. (level)

### FIRST YEAR SCIENCE

Students passing S. Y. J. C. (Std. XII) with Science subjects only. Vocational courses/MCVC with relevant subject combinations/students with Post SSC 3 Year Engineering Diploma who have at least completed 2nd year with required subjects as per ordinance no. 0.2145 are eligible for admission to F.Y.B. Sc.

### FIRST YEAR COMMERCE

Students passing S. Y. J. C. (Std. XII) Commerce or S. Y. J. C. Science with mathematics or S. Y. J. C. (Commerce) with vocational subjects are eligible for admission to F. Y. B. Com.

Students passing Diploma in Administration Services (Commercial and Secretarial Practices) conducted by Premila Vithaldas Polytechnic, S.N.D.T. Women's University are eligible for admission to F.Y.B.Com.

**Students coming from Universities/Board other than Maharashtra State:** Students coming from outside, i.e. other than Maharashtra State Board, will be admitted to the college on the basis of provisional eligibility certificate. In case the admission of the student is found to be invalid for any reason, the responsibility will lie with the student. Students will account for the gap if any, between H.S.C. and joining F. Y. Class by submitting a gap certificate, N.O.C. & T.C. from the previous institute.

**Admission under Minority Quota (Sindhi):** Students seeking admission at FY level under 'minority category' are required to produce documentary proof (affidavit) certifying their Sindhi status. It is desirable that they complete the Sindhi Certificate Course.

**International Students:** Foreign students seeking admission are required to submit the following documents:

a) Photocopy of Passport b) Copy of Transcript

# **Documents Required for Admission:**

Students should bring the following documents in original along with duly attested photocopies for verification at the time of admission:

- a) For F.Y. Admission, it is mandatory to register for Pre-admission Enrollment form online at <a href="https://www.mum.digitaluniversity.ac">www.mum.digitaluniversity.ac</a> and submit the same along with college admission form.
- b) Original Mark sheet of H.S.C., two photocopies of H.S.C. Mark sheet, one photocopy of S.S.C. mark sheet and one photo copy of Leaving Certificate (LC) for F.Y. admission.
- c) Original Mark sheet of Sem-I & II along with one photo copy for S.Y. admission.
- d) Original Mark sheet of Sem-I, II, III & IV along with one photo copy each for T.Y. admission
- e) For new admission at S.Y./ T.Y.-NOC with enrolment details to be produced from the previous-college.
- f) One recent Passport size photograph taken in a light coloured dress for all classes.
- g) One recent Passport size photograph of Parent/Guardian.
- h) Address Proof (photo copy of Ration Card/Electricity Bill/Telephone Bill/Passport/Driving License, Aadhar Card. any one)
- i) You are requested to preserve your Current ID. Card. & Revalidate from the College office after commencement of the college.
- j) Caste Certificate (if applicable)
- k) Documentary evidence regarding special category status
- l) Eligibility Certificate (students coming from other than Maharashtra Board and Maharashtra Technical Board). Eligibility forms will be distributed by the colleges and the same will be resubmitted to the college along with necessary documents. (eligibility fees Rs. 220/-Rs.320/- and Rs. 750/- as the case may be). **Admission will be provisional till University approves the documents.**
- m) Physically challenged candidates should produce the relevant Certificate from competent authority.

**NOTE 1:** In case the original mark sheet of H.S.C. has been submitted for admission to any college, a certificate to that effect, signed by the Principal of that College must be produced.

**NOTE 2:** University Enrolment forms are required to be submitted on-line by First Year Students to confirm their admissions.

# **ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES**

### **Additional Credit Program:**

This special program, referred to as ACP, is a unique program offered solely to the students of VESASC. It caters to the needs of advanced learners. It is an interdisciplinary advanced level program designed to provide an educational experience from diverse fields to nurture the growth of the student academically, socially, emotionally and intellectually and to sensitize him/her towards the vast research potential in his/her field of interest.



The college strives for a robust mechanism for developing and strengthening the research ecosystem with integrity and research ethics. Building research capacity among students teachers and through research monitoring and is the administration significant objective of the research development cell. The college has a Research Circle which helps teachers prepare their research proposals, provides information on funding avenues and also holds seminars and research poster competitions for students and teachers.

### **Educational Visits:**

Several departments of the college arrange educational tours and industrial visits for their students. This widens the horizons of our students, giving them an opportunity to see the application of theoretical texts and gauge how reality may actually be different from bookish knowledge.









# EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

## **Sports**

Sports are seen as an integral part of education. college encourages both sports sportsmanship. Through the Sports Department, we provide facilities and opportunities to young students for enhancement of their athletic skills and fitness. Last year two sports in-charges have been appointed by the college to improve the sports training facilities provided to our students. Annual Sports Day is conducted every year during the month of November/December. Over the years many students of the college have represented the state and the country in various athletic events. Last year two students of the BMS department, Mr. Ritesh Borade and Ms. Ritika Mahavar won the Asian gold medal as well as the state gold medal in Acrobatic Gymnastics. VES promises to nurture all sportsmen and sportswomen who will represent India in the future.



The Cultural Forum of the college organizes events and competitions throughout the year. We have made provision for a special one hour time slot in our time table, once a week for co-curricular and extracurricular activities. This time slot is known as 'Forum Time' and is between 11:10 a.m and 12:20 p.m. on Saturday. No lectures are conducted during this time, which is devoted entirely to extracurricular activities.

### **Talentia and Annual Day**

Talentia is the most awaited Annual Cultural Festival of the college. This is the occasion during which students exhibit their talents in a variety of cultural events that fall under the categories of Performing Arts, Fine Arts and Literary Arts.

The Annual Day program at VES is rich in meaning and spirit. The program appreciates the academic, and cultural achievements of our students. The academic toppers are awarded and the cultural programs performed by our students in various inter-collegiate festivals are showcased.











### Music

There is a well-equipped Music Room where interested students are provided training in Hindustani Classical music by our music teacher Shri Santosh More. Sir is associated with Gandharv Mahavidyalaya from where students can give qualifying exams in music. Music workshops are also conducted.




### **Sindhi Association**

# STUDENT WELFARE ACTIVITIES

**Women Development Cell:** Aim of WDC is to build a gender sensitive campus and address concerns of gender discrimination. WDC follows UWDC guidelines to achieve gender parity at the campus. WDC aims to prevent sexual harassment at campus Following the UGC guidelines (2015) based on the Sexual Harassment Act of 2013, college has the Internal committee team that addresses complaints of sexual harrassment.

**Career and Placement Cell:** The Cell conducts activities for guiding the students in developing employability skills and selecting a good career. It conducts campus placements for Third Year students to make them confident and financially independent. The placement fair is also conducted by CGPC that helps to gain the employability amongst students. Various companies in which our students are placed are Wipro, TCS, Deloitte, L&T InfoTech, Willis Towers Watson and many more. Internship opportunities are also offered to the First-year and Second-year students.

**Personal Counselor:** College life can be challenging and is often stressful. Students experience these challenges in a number of different ways: difficulties adjusting to college, confusion in deciding on a major career path, struggles in relationships, or-friends. The college has an appointed counselor for students to help them identify more effective strategies to cope with difficult situations and to achieve their goals. All services are rendered free of cost.

# DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

### **Departmental Associations**

Many departments have a student association that conducts co-curricular activities throughout the year where students learn more about their subjects through non-academic activities and also develop organizational and leadership skills. Participation in departmental association activities also carries credits in some semesters.



### **Inter-collegiate Event - VESCON**

Various departments and departmental associations used to organize intercollegiate academic events Chem-Talentia (Chemistry) Confluence (B.M.S) Sagacity (I.T). Vihaan (Comp. Science), Kaun Banega Physicist (Physics) and Arvestus (BAF). Mathemight (Mathematics), Niraya (BFM), Confluence (BMS), Euphonity (B&I), Impressions (BAMMC). These vibrant events facilitated interaction of our students with students of other colleges. Last year these were all clubbed together to have a three day mega event -VESCON. All departments hosted students of other colleges as participants in a varied variety of cocurricular events. The inaugural session was chaired by Shri Ashish Shelar, member of Maharashtra Legislative Assembly. Many celebrities also attended the event which saw participation from over 18 colleges.

# **EXTENSION ACTIVITIES**

### Life Long Learning and Extension (LLE)

The college has an active department of Lifelong Learning and Extension (DLLE). The department conducts activities in accordance with the guidelines given by University of Mumbai. The main objective of LLE is to sensitize students towards social responsibility and to inculcate in them leadership qualities and team spirit. In the past we have worked on projects like Survey of Women Status(SWS), Population Education Club (PEC) and Career Project (CP) with participation of around 500+ students every year. Students who complete the 120 hours of extension work are eligible for credits in some semesters.



The N.S.S. unit of our college has been in existence since 1982, with the primary objective of arousing social consciousness and providing the students with opportunity to work with the community. In the process, the unit also aims to enhance the personality of the participating volunteers. The Government of India and Ministry of Education and Culture in collaboration with the State Government sponsors the programme. The unit conducts various activities such as blood donation camps, books distribution, tree plantation etc. Students have to complete 30 hours of volunteer work to get additional marks/credits.

#### **Outreach Cell**

Our college has a social service cell called "Out-reach". This cell is dedicated to social and extension activities at sister institutions and national and international NGOs. Our endeavor is to sensitize our students towards the physically challenged, visually impaired and differently abled students of our community. In the past five years we have developed interactions with many NGO's and social groups like Youth for Seva which works for Adivasi children, Bal Anand, NASEOH as well as with institutions in the neighborhood such as TISS and the NGO, HUM.











# **AMENITIES**

### Introduction

The college, which is set over a 4-acre campus and has a built-up area of 6878 sq.m., assists students in achieving their academic goals while also enhancing their personalities.

### DST-FIST AND DBT-STAR COLLEGE GRANT

VES College of ASC is a proud recipient of the "FIST- Fund for Improvement of Sciences and Technology infrastructure "grant from "DST-Department of Science and Technology "and "Star

College Grant" from "DBT-Department of Biotechnology". It gave us an opportunity to upgrade our science laboratories and helped in promotion of Science Education, making it exciting by shaping our curriculum to extend enriching learning opportunities for our students. Three department viz. Chemistry, Physics, Microbiology were selected as Recipients of FIST grant by DST. We have been sanctioned Rs. 80 lakhs under FIST grant. Five departments viz. Chemistry, Physics, Microbiology, Biotechnology and Computer Science were selected as recipients of the Star College grant. We have been sanctioned Rs.58 lakhs under this grant

## **Central Instrumentation Facility**

We have a Central Instrumentation Facility having high end research equipment, namely - HPLC, FTIR and UV-Visible etc. It will be a great facility for the Chemistry, Physics, Microbiology departments as they are recognized Ph D. Centres and therefore can avail the facility to undertake several research projects. This will definitely give an impetus to research activity at the college.

### Laboratories

- The college has separate laboratories for Physics, Chemistry, Microbiology, Psychology & Computer Science. B.Sc. IT, Biotechnology, Mathematics & Language Lab
  - **Physics:** Two main Laboratories, One dark room where about 3 batches of 20 students each can work at a time.
  - **Chemistry:** One big laboratory where 4 batches of 20 students each can work at a time and one small lab where 2 batches of 20 students can work. Besides there is a separate Physical Chemistry laboratory, three Post-graduate Chemistry laboratories, an instrumentation laboratory and store-room.
  - Microbiology: One big undergraduate laboratory, two post-graduate laboratories, an instrument room, along with cubicles equipped with a laminar airflow system.
  - o **Biotechnology:** One undergraduate lab and one Animal Tissue Culture lab
  - **Psychology:** One laboratory with relevant equipment and materials. It has a computer with internet connection, OHP and LCD projector.
  - Computer Science: Three full-fledged computer labs equipped with the latest software & hardware. The labs are constantly updated to cater to the current demands
  - o **Information Technology:** Full-fledged computer labs equipped with the latest
    - software & hardware. The labs are constantly updated to cater to the current demands
  - **Mathematics**: One lab
  - Media and Language Lab: Equipped with computers and television
- Laboratory Equipment: All the laboratories are adequately equipped as per the University norm.

#### LIBRARY RULES:

- 1. Every student must possess his/her Identity card for use of the Library. Books and other material will be issued against valid ID card only.
- 2. Complete Silence must be maintained in the Library. Any student who is found causing any sort of disturbance in the Library is liable to be debarred from the Library facilities.

- 3. Students can get any book i.e. Textbooks, reference books, Reference Sources for reading in the Reading Room against his/her Identity Card. If such a book is taken outside without the permission of the Librarian then a non compliance charge of Rs. 10/- will be charged and no book will be issued to him/her in future.
- 4. Newspapers and Periodicals are issued against Identity Card for Reading in the Reading Room. Bound volumes of journals will be issued for current reading only.
- 5. When books are issued, students should check the pages of the issued books and if pages are found missing, they should report the same to the Library staff before leaving the counter. On returning the books if pages are found missing the last borrower of the book shall be held accountable for the missing pages and penalty will be levied accordingly.
- 6. Students are required to handle books and reading material very carefully. Marking Library books with pencil or ink, tearing the pages or spoiling the same in any other way will be viewed very seriously. In such a case, the last reader will be held responsible unless he shows the Library staff at the time of issue that the book had been previously marked or damaged. In the event of damage of any kind, the last reader will be liable to compensate for damage. Books will have to be replaced and an additional cost of Rs. 10/- will have to be paid as processing charges.
- 7. It is observed that some of the students do not return the Library Books on or before the due date stamped on the date slip in the book, thus depriving other students using the Library facilities. In order to prevent such students from keeping Library books with them for longer than normal, overdue charges will be as follows:-

After the due date Re. 2/- per day

Onsite /Current book : Rs 5/- per day

- 8. In case a Reader loses a book he/she should replace the book. In case the book cannot be replaced; the current price of the book and an additional charge of Rs. 10/- as processing charges will have to be paid.
- 9. Membership card is non-transferable. Students must not lend their Identity Card to any other student to borrow books from the Library. Library facilities will be suspended for students misusing cards.
- 10. The College Leaving Certificate or Transfer Certificate will be issued to student only after he/she has returned all the Library books.
- 11. Students should not speak on Mobile Phones in the Library. They must go out and attend/make their call so as to avoid disturbance to others. Suitable action will be faced by Students flouting the rules.

# National Education Policy 2020 and its implementation in the academic year 2023-24

The world is undergoing rapid changes in the knowledge landscape. With various dramatic scientific and technological advances, such as the rise of big data, machine learning, and artificial intelligence, many unskilled jobs worldwide may be taken over by machines, while the need for a skilled workforce, particularly involving mathematics, computer science, and data science, in conjunction with multidisciplinary abilities across the sciences, social sciences, and humanities, will be increasingly in greater demand. With climate change, increasing pollution, and depleting natural resources, there will be a sizeable shift in how we meet the world's energy, water, food, and sanitation needs, again resulting in the need for new skilled labour. The growing emergence of epidemics and pandemics will also call for collaborative research in infectious disease management and development of vaccines and the resultant social issues heightens the need for multidisciplinary learning. There will be a growing demand for humanities and art, as India moves towards becoming a developed country as well as among the three largest economies in the world. Education thus, must move less towards content, and more towards learning about how to think critically and solve problems, how to be creative and multidisciplinary, and innovate, adapt, and absorb new material in novel and changing fields. Pedagogy must evolve to make education more experiential, holistic. integrated, inquiry-driven, discovery-oriented, learner-centered. discussion-based, flexible, and, of course, enjoyable. Education must build character, enable learners to be ethical, rational, compassionate, and caring, while at the same time prepare them for gainful, fulfilling employment.

This National Education Policy 2020 is the first education policy of the 21st century and aims to address the many growing developmental imperatives of our country. This Policy proposes the revision and revamping of all aspects of the education structure, including its regulation and governance, to create a new system that is aligned with the aspirational goals of 21st century education. It is based on the principle that education must develop not only cognitive capacities both the 'foundational capacities 'of literacy and numeracy and 'higher-order' cognitive capacities, such as critical thinking and problem solving – but also social, ethical, and emotional capacities and dispositions.

# Quality Universities and Colleges: A New and Forward-looking Vision for India's Higher Education System

Higher education plays an extremely important role in promoting human as well as societal wellbeing and in developing India as envisioned in its Constitution. Higher education significantly contributes towards sustainable livelihoods and economic development of the nation. As India moves towards becoming a knowledge economy and society, more and more young Indians are likely to aspire for higher education.

The policy's vision includes the following key changes to the current system:

- (a) moving towards a more multidisciplinary undergraduate education;
- (b) moving towards faculty and institutional autonomy;

- (c) Internationalization of HE
- (d) Emphasis Regional Language in Education including Technical Education
- (e) revamping curriculum, pedagogy, assessment, and student support for enhanced student experiences;
- (f) governance of HEIs by high qualified independent boards having academic and administrative autonomy;

VES College of Arts, Science and Commerce being an autonomous institute since 2020-21, will be able to implement this policy to the greatest extent and achieve its goals of a multidisciplinary and flexible education system that allows students to learn and grow in a holistic and independent manner with each student getting the freedom to learn and develop skills that they desire.

## **NEP Implementation in First Phase:**

The implementation of the National Education Policy in the academic year 2023-24 stresses on two aspects primarily,

- (i) Multiple entry/exit points giving the student the freedom to learn at their own pace, and
- (ii) Multidisciplinary model of learning, allowing the student the flexibility to take courses from different streams according to their choice and the demand of the field which they wish to undertake in the future.
- (i) Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit options: Students from this year onwards do not have to do a three year bachelor's degree mandatorily. The bachelor's program is now divided into four years. The student can exit the program at the end of even semester and make reentry at the odd semester depending on their requirement.

The structure of the Three/Four-year bachelor's degree programme allows the opportunity to the students to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education in addition to a focus on the chosen major and minors as per their choices and the feasibility.

Depending upon how many years of the program the student completes, they will be given the following degrees:

Qualification Title	Duration (in years)	Semesters
UG Certificate	1	2
UG Diploma	2	4
Bachelor's Degree	3	6
Bachelor's Degree with Honours	4	8

At the end of every even semester, the student has the freedom to leave the course. If they wish to do so, they will be asked to take up an additional skill-based course on the completion of which they will be awarded the above mentioned degree.

If the student continues with the course for four years, they get an Honours' degree which is equivalent to doing one year of post graduation.

This program also allows the student to enter any course at different stages, provided they have earned the required mandatory credits of that entry point. This gives the student the opportunity to switch fields, if they feel the degree they are pursuing is not suitable for them. This is a huge opportunity for students who take up a course and then realize that they are not comfortable in the field they have chosen. So if an engineering student wishes to switch fields and take up regular B.Sc. the years they spend in engineering will not go wasted, depending on the credits they have earned and the subjects they have learned they can join the B.Sc. programme at a parallel stage.

(ii) Multidisciplinary mode of learning: This system of learning has been designed keeping the current economy in mind. In the current times, it is very important for every individual to have the basic knowledge of all fields. Also, a very diverse set of skills is required by every individual, irrespective of which stream they are in. For example, to succeed in the field of E-commerce, one needs to have the knowledge of commerce, management as well as Information Technology. The burgeoning pharmaceutical industry requires experts with knowledge of drug chemistry, human biology and marketing and management skills.

Keeping this in mind, all the programs have been designed in such a way that apart from doing core courses in their main subject the students will have to choose and take up multidisciplinary courses from different streams. For instance, an arts graduate can take up a few courses in either commerce or science. Apart from this skill based courses will be provided in every semester to give the students the employable skills required by the industry they wish to join. Certain skills such as communication and research will be a part of every course. Students will also be asked to take up either research projects or internships at the third year level to have expertise and experience in their chosen stream. All these will carry credits which the student has to acquire for the completion of the degree. Students will be encouraged to acquire extra credits by doing online courses from government registered sites such as SWAYAM. Field projects, intership, community engagement and on-job-training have also been introduced as a part of the curriculum.

Every student will have to earn credits by choosing major, minor, multidisciplinary (open elective), ability and skill enhancement courses, value added courses. These credits will be deposited in the national level repository called "Academic Bank of Credits- ABC". Whenever a student at any level will earn more than 50% of the credits from a major subject, he or she will be awarded a degree in that subject.

In conclusion, the National Education Policy is a boon to the students who are preparing themselves to become the workforce of a growing economy such as India. The work environment is demanding creativity, diversification and risk-taking ability for every individual. The stress now is on becoming entrepreneurs rather than an employee. This new education system has been developed keeping all this in mind. It promises to allow the student to learn everything they want and require for their future. It will ensure that the students acquire the skill set that makes them ready to face the challenges at workfront. It is a different and new way of learning that will be enjoyable and engrossing for every adolescent as they grow into responsible citizens of our great nation.

# **Examination**

# **Choice Based Credit Semester System (CBCS)**

### **Assessment and Evaluation Pattern**

The performance of each learner will be evaluated in two components.

- For UG programs Internal: Total marks 25, External: Total marks 75. Individual passing in both internal and external exams is a must.
- For PG programs Internal: Total marks 40, External: Total marks 60. Individual passing in both internal and external exams is a must.
- Internal exams would include a minimum of two academic activities (Test/PPT/Project etc.)

### **Passing Standard**

- There would be no internal exams for Practical Papers.
- Passing in each individual head is a minimum of 40% (Independently in External and Internal).
- However, overall grades would be given by combining marks of External and Internal exams in aggregate for each course.
- ATKT as per University Norms.

## **Grading System-10 POINT**

Revised Scheme of Evaluation under Choice Based Credit and Grading System (CBCS) for UG programs is applicable from the A.Y. 2022-2023 progressively.

- **II) Medium of Instruction:** Our College is an English Medium College hence the instructions in all the subjects are imparted through English language only. Students must write their examinations in English only.
- **III) Arrangement of Terms:** Reopening/ First Term The First Term will start on **13th June, 2023.** Second Term & Exact schedule will be notified later.
- **IV) College Timings:** The first lecture starts at 7.30 am and the last lecture typically ends at 5.20 pm. The students might have different timetables depending on their course.
- **V) Holidays:** The college will remain closed on Sundays and all public holidays as declared by the Government of Maharashtra and on such other days as the Principal declares from time to time.
- **VI) Granting of Terms:** The college will grant terms on the basis of (a) 75% attendance in lectures and in Practicals separately in each term/each subject. (b) Good conduct.

According to University rules attendance at lectures, practical and tutorials is compulsory. The minimum attendance required for granting the term is three fourth of the days on which lectures, Practicals and tutorials are conducted. (Ordinance 0.6086). Attendance will be condoned on medical grounds by 10% (A student must keep minimum 65% attendance) provided it is substantiated by relevant medical certificate within a week of getting the fitness certificate. Parents/ Guardians are requested to check their ward's attendance from the college regularly.

**VII] ATKT Examination:** Candidates who have been declared failed at the examination or who have been allowed to keep terms for the higher class shall appear for the ATKT examination of respective semester held by the college. ATKT Examination will be conducted in each semester and notification will be made. Details of the ATKT Examination can be obtained from the office as and when required. Students will have to fill the ATKT exam before appearing in the ATKT examination.

VIII] Railway Concession: All students are eligible to avail concession for railway journeys between the stations near to the place of their residence in Mumbai and the college, and for journeys between their place of permanent residence (where the students or his parents normally reside as declared in their application form for admission) and Mumbai during vacations. Students are required to enter their local and permanent address correctly in the admission form to facilitate the issue of Railway Concession order. The student may be required to produce documentary evidence of his/her residential address. If necessary.

- **IX) Students Council: (In charge- Prof. Vikas Ware)** Nomination of all the members of the student council will be held as per the rules prescribed by the University and on the dates announced by it.
- The student council shall consist of the following:

- o One student from each class, who has shown academic merit at the examination held in the preceding year and who is engaged in the full time studies in the college, nominated by the principal.
- o One student from each of the activities, who has shown outstanding performance, nominated by the Principal namely: Sports, National Service Scheme and Adult Education, Cultural Activities.
- o Two lady students nominated by the principal.
- The student members of the student council shall elect from amongst themselves, the secretary
  of their council and his or her name will be sent to the Students Council of the University.
- All the members of the Students Council shall help the Principal in the maintenance of the order and discipline among the students in general and at the time of college functions in particular, and they shall not use their position to be irregular in attending lectures, practicals or any other way harming the interest of the institution.
- **X) Identity Card:** No duplicate Identity Card will ordinarily be issued. The loss of Identity card should be immediately reported to the Principal, Vice Principal along with a detailed written explanation of the circumstance in which the Identity card was lost. The report of the loss of Identity card should be reinforced with a police complaint made to the nearest police station. The Principal may issue an Identity card after considering the propriety of the concerned student. Serious disciplinary action will be taken against students for misusing the Identity Card. The students will be charged Rs. 500/-for duplicate Id Card.
- **XI) College Discipline**: The institution attaches utmost importance to discipline and character building. Therefore, the following rules must be followed by the students:
  - The College premises are under 24 hours Electronic Surveillance.
  - Students shall not be allowed to enter the college premises without showing the valid Identity Card. Penalty for not wearing the Identity Card is Rs. 100/-
  - Students shall attend all classes, tutorials, seminars, practical and college examinations according to the time-table. Students remaining absent shall submit a leave note signed by their parents/ guardians stating reasons for their absenteeism. Absenteeism on medical grounds should be supported by a medical certificate. In all cases, absenteeism over three days should be immediately brought to the notice of the authority.
  - Students will not go for a job, or work or business or private coaching during the college hours. If anyone misses the lectures/practicals for that reason, his/her admission is liable to be canceled immediately.
  - Students shall not bring with them unauthorized persons into the college premises.
  - Students shall take proper care of all college property. Any damage done to the property of the college by disfiguring walls, rooms, windows and fittings or breaking the furniture and such things is a breach of discipline and will be punishable. As such damage done to the college property will have to be made good by the concerned class students.
  - The Students should come decently dressed to the college. Informal dresses will not be permitted in the college premises. Boys-Full Pant/jeans with shirt/T-shirt with sleeves. Boys should cut their hair short. Girls-Salwar Kameez/ or jeans pants/long skirts with tops/T-shirts with sleeves. For violation of dress code there will be a penalty of Rs. 100/-
  - Associations/Organizations will be formed only after the prior permission of the Principal.
  - Collecting funds for any purpose is strictly prohibited unless scrutinized and permitted by the Principal.
  - SMOKING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED in the college premises.

- The college has an anti-ragging cell. Any incidents of ragging or harassment of a student by another student must be reported and will be dealt with very strictly.
- The loss of mark-sheet should be immediately reported to the Principal/Vice Principal along with a detailed written explanation of the circumstances in which the mark-sheet was lost. The report of the loss of mark-sheet should be reinforced with a police complaint made to the nearest police station and an affidavit (on a Rs.50/- Stamp paper) specifying details. The Principal may issue a duplicate mark-sheet after considering the propriety of the concerned student. Serious disciplinary action will be taken against students for misusing the mark-sheet. The students will be charged Rs.100/-for duplicate mark-sheet.

**B)** Internal Complaint Committee: (In charge- Dr. Ritika Makhijani) As the guidelines provided by UGC and University of Mumbai for prevention of Sexual Harassment of Women at workplace, the Management of V.E.S. College of Arts, Science & Commerce has constituted the "Internal Complaint Committee". The objectives of the committee are to evolve a permanent mechanism for the prevention and redressed of sexual harassment of the committee and other acts of gender based violence at the institute, to uphold the commitment of the Institute to provide an environment free of gender based discrimination and to create a secure physical and social environment to deter any act of sexual harassment.

- (c) Music Class: Music Department conducts several performing arts classes such as Hindustani Classical, Vocal, violin, guitar, Casio and table. These classes are conducted only for our students. No fee is charged. The classes are conducted in the music room of the college premises between 2:00 p.m. to 6:00p.m.
