3. How to Earn Scholarship for Higher Education?

Purpose/Objective:

The primary goal of this session was to raise awareness among students about the various higher education opportunities available abroad and to provide them with practical strategies for securing scholarships to fund their studies at foreign universities. By the end of the session, students were expected to have a clearer understanding of the scholarship landscape and be inspired to actively pursue these opportunities.

Outcomes:

By the end of the session, students gained:

• A comprehensive understanding of the various scholarship opportunities available for higher education abroad.

- Clarity on the application process and the components of a strong scholarship application.
- Inspiration and motivation to actively plan and pursue scholarships, enhancing their chances of studying at foreign universities.

4. Career Guidance for MPSC & UPSC Preparation

Purpose/Objective -

The session intended to create an awareness amongst the students about the Career Guidance and Placement Cell activities, several openings in the Government jobs and to encourage them to identify their strengths, skills.

Outcomes -

Number of students attended - 106

The students got clarity on the stages of the UPSC examination - the Preliminary Exam (Prelims), the Mains Exam, and the Interview (Personality Test). The students were briefed about the subjects, general studies and optional subjects. The major takeaway from the session was a clear understanding of the steps that needs to be taken for preparing for the toughest examination in India. The session encouraged and inspired students to think of planning for the most coveted positions in the country's civil services





5. Workshop on Introduction to Python

Purpose/Objective:

The primary aim of this workshop was to introduce non-IT students to Python programming, emphasizing its versatility and applicability across various fields. The session sought to increase awareness and understanding of Python technologies, demonstrating how they can be leveraged in diverse domains such as data analysis, automation, web development, and more.

Outcomes:

Number of students attended - 43

By the end of the workshop, students achieved:

- Hands-on experience with basic Python coding, fostering confidence to explore programming further.





6. Resume writing, GD, PI Guidance Session for Third Year Science Students

Purpose/Objective:

The primary aim of this session was to equip third-year science students with essential skills and knowledge regarding the various components of the recruitment process, including resume writing, group discussions, and personal interviews. By the end of the session, students were expected to have a clear understanding of how to effectively prepare their resumes, participate in group discussions, and excel in personal interviews.
