22nd February 2026 marked the birth centenary of our esteemed founder, Hashu Advani—a visionary leader whose commitment to education continues to inspire generations. The academic year 2025–26 was commemorated across all institutions of Vivekanand Education Society as the *Hashu Advani Centenary Celebration*, honoring his enduring legacy.

At VES College of Arts, Science and Commerce, the year was observed under the theme ‘*Gen Z for Nation Building*’, reflecting the dynamic role of young minds in shaping the future. India’s Gen Z—born between 1997 and 2012—stands at the forefront of transformation, harnessing technology, innovation, and civic responsibility to contribute meaningfully to national progress. As digital natives, they actively engage with emerging ecosystems such as startups and digital public infrastructure, driving solutions to contemporary challenges and strengthening India’s journey towards a developed and self-reliant future.

As part of the centenary celebrations, four significant programs were organized, each reflecting the spirit of intellectual growth, youth empowerment, and holistic development:

On 31st January 2026, the college hosted a *Multidisciplinary National Conference on “Transforming India through Research & Innovation: A Roadmap to Viksit Bharat @2040”*, which witnessed participation from over 100 delegates. The conference featured a thought-provoking plenary lecture, an engaging panel discussion on the central theme, and poster presentations by participants from diverse disciplines across Arts, Science, and Commerce.

An interactive session titled “*Living with Clarity and Confidence*” by Swami Swaroopanand, *Global Head of Chinmaya Mission*, was organized by the Department of Psychology on 19th January 2026. The session commemorated National Youth Day and marked the 75th anniversary of the Mission, offering students valuable insights into purposeful living.

On 4th February 2026, an illuminating session on the Union Budget 2026–27 was delivered by *Ameet Satam, Honorable Member of the Legislative Assembly and Mumbai BJP President*, to a packed auditorium at VESASC. The session was telecast live in an interactive mode across all VES institutes. He highlighted the relevance of the Union Budget for Gen Z, particularly in shaping education funding, skill development initiatives, and employment opportunities for young people.

A thought-provoking talk titled “*Succeeding Without Stress – A Spiritual Approach to Managing the Pressure to Perform*” was conducted on 11th February 2026 by life coach and author *Manisha Melwani*. 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Welcome to Vivekanand Education Society

Vivekanand Education Society (VES) was established in 1962. VES runs 26 institutions in the vicinity of Chembur. The society's aim is to impart quality education to all, including economically backward classes, thereby playing an important role in the progress of our country—a vision of our founder, Shri Hashu Advaniji, a great social worker.

This year marks the centenary birth anniversary of Shri Hashu Advaniji. The celebrations for this occasion culminated on 22nd February, 2026.

All institutions are located in Kurla and Chembur, a lush green suburb that is conveniently accessible from any part of Mumbai. Today, VES has a vibrant community of students, faculty, staff, and alumni. Over 22,000 students enroll in our pre-primary, primary, secondary, and higher secondary schools, as well as graduate, postgraduate, and doctoral programs.

We nurture higher educational proficiencies in fields such as arts, science, commerce, engineering, management, pharmacy, law, polytechnic studies, and architecture. VES believes in the overall development of its students and, therefore, has a dedicated leadership academy, sports academy, catering & craft center, and vocational guidance institutes.

For outstation students, VES provides separate hostel facilities for girls and boys.

About the College, VESASC

Vivekanand Education Society's College of Arts, Science, and Commerce (Autonomous) was established in June 1979 as a multi-faculty institution. It is permanently affiliated with the University of Mumbai and recognized by the UGC under sections 2(f) and 12B. Our college has Sindhi linguistic minority status.

The college was re-accredited by NAAC (3rd Cycle) with an A grade (CGPA 3.26) in August 2017. We were conferred with autonomous status by the UGC and the University of Mumbai from the academic year 2021-2022. As an autonomous institution, the college designs its own curriculum, while the degree is awarded by the parent university—University of Mumbai.

The college successfully implemented the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) in the year 2023-24. All programs now follow the NEP pattern. Additionally, two programs, Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS) and Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA), have received AICTE approval. The first batch of NEP graduated in the academic year 2025-26.

The college was honored with the Best College Award by the University of Mumbai in the year 2012-2013 (Urban Area). It also received grants from DST under the FIST scheme and the Star College Grant from DBT in the year 2015-2016.

In 2024, the college received a grant of ₹5 crore under the Pradhan Mantri Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan. VESASC is the only college in the Mumbai suburbs to have received this grant.

Our goal is to impart quality education and contribute to the character building of students. Our commitment to this mission is reflected in our curriculum, where continuous efforts are made to enhance the relevance and effectiveness of educational programs.

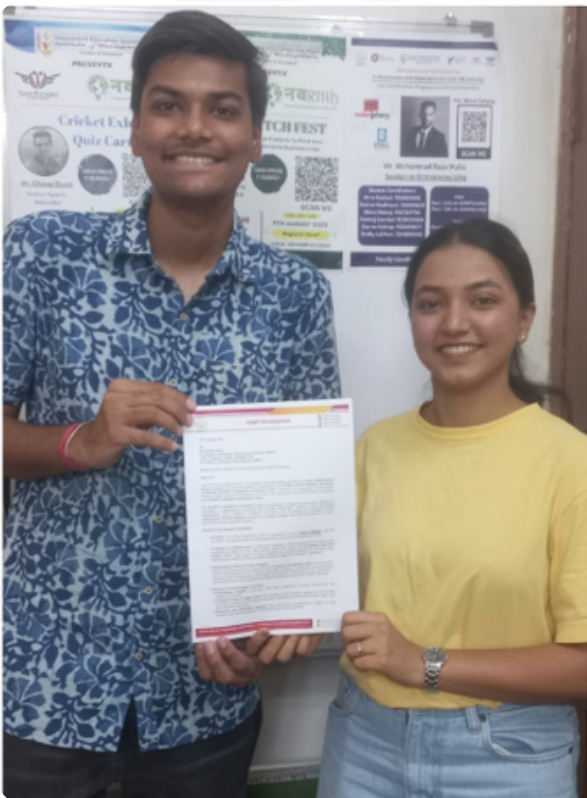

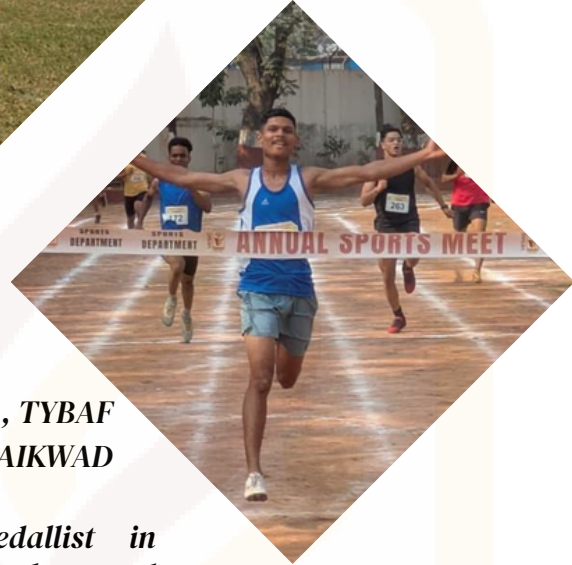

(a) Major (Core) Subject comprising Mandatory and Elective Courses:

- i. Minimum 50% of total credits corresponding to Three/Four - year UG Degree- Mandatory Courses offered in all Four years;
- ii. 2 credit course on Major Specific IKS shall be included under Major;
- iii. Elective courses of Major will be offered in the third and/or final year.
- iv. Vocational Skill Courses, Internship/ Apprenticeship, Field Projects, Research Projects connected to Major

(b) Minor Subject: 18-20 Credits

- i. The Minor subjects may be from the different disciplines of the same
- ii. faculty of DSC Major (Core) or they can be from different faculty altogether.
- iii. The credits of Minor subjects shall be completed in the first three years of UG Programme.

(c) Generic/ Open Elective Courses (OE): 10-12 credits

- i. It is to be offered in I and/or II year
- ii. Faculty-wise baskets of OE shall be prepared by University/Autonomous Colleges.
- iii. OE is to be chosen compulsorily from faculty other than that of the Major.

(d) Vocational and Skill Enhancement Courses (VSEC): 14-16 credits

- **Vocational Skill Courses (VSC):** 8-10 credits, including Hands on Training corresponding to the Major and/or Minor Subject:
 - i. To be offered in first three years;
 - ii. Wherever applicable vocational courses will include skills based on advanced laboratory practicals of Major
- **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** 06 credits
 - i. To be offered in I and II year;
 - ii. To be selected from the basket of Skill Courses approved by University/ Autonomous Colleges

(e) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Indian Knowledge System (IKS) and Value Education Courses (VEC): 14 Credits

- **AEC: 08 credits**
 - i. To be offered in I and II year English: 04 Credits
 - ii. Modern Indian Language: 04 credits To be offered from the Basket approved by University /Autonomous College;
 - iii. The focus for both languages should be on linguistic and communication skills.
- **IKS: 2 Credits**
 - i. To be offered in I Year
 - ii. Courses on IKS to be selected from the basket of IKS courses approved by University/ Autonomous Colleges
- **VEC: 04 Credits**
 - i. To be offered in I year
 - ii. Value Education Courses (VEC) such as Understanding India, Environmental Science/Education, and Digital and Technological Solutions.

(f) Field Projects/ Internship/ Apprenticeship/ Community Engagement and Service corresponding to the Major (Core) Subject, Co-curricular Courses (CC) and Research Project

- **Internship/Apprenticeship** corresponding to the Major (Core) Subject: 8 Credits
- **Field Projects/Community Engagement and Service** corresponding to the Major (Core) Subject: minimum 4-6 credits. To be offered in II, and III years of UG Degree Programmes.
- **Co-curricular Courses (CC)** such as Health and Wellness, Yoga education sports, and fitness, Cultural Activities, NSS/NCC and Fine/ Applied/ Visual/ Performing Arts: 8 credits. To be offered in I and/or II year
- **Research Projects:** 12 credits. To be offered in the final year for 4 year Honours with Research UG Degree

The UGC Regulations, 2021 permit up to 40% of the total courses being offered in a particular programme in a semester through the **Online Learning Courses** offered through the **SWAYAM** platform and/or other State Level Common Platforms which can be developed in due course with the participation of different Universities/ HEIs.

At Vivekanand Education Society's College of Arts, Science and Commerce, we embraced the National Education Policy (NEP) in 2023–24 with a clear goal—to make learning more meaningful, flexible, and relevant. This year marks a special milestone as the first batch of NEP students graduated in 2025–26. Their journey has been encouraging, and we are happy to share their reflections and experiences for our readers to glimpse what NEP learning truly feels like.

NEP moves beyond traditional classroom learning. It recognises that today's world needs individuals who can think critically, adapt quickly, and work across disciplines. At VESASC, this philosophy comes alive through flexibility and choice.

Students can now shape their own academic path with multiple entry and exit options, earning a certificate, diploma, or degree based on their learning journey. More importantly, they are encouraged to explore beyond their core subject.

In the first year, students choose two Open Electives, and one in the second year, from across streams. This means a science student can explore psychology or economics, while a commerce student might discover an interest in environmental science or literature. Such choices open new perspectives and often lead to unexpected passions. What makes this experience even more vibrant is our unique Open Elective (OE) Mela. Here, students present what they have learned from courses outside their own stream—sharing ideas, projects, and insights with their peers. The mela becomes a space for peer-to-peer and multidisciplinary learning, where classrooms expand into conversations. This initiative, now copyrighted by VESASC, reflects our commitment to innovative education.

Alongside this, students engage in skill-based courses, internships, research, and community work—ensuring that learning is not just theoretical, but lived.

At its heart, NEP at VESASC is about giving students the freedom to explore, the confidence to adapt, and the ability to grow into well-rounded individuals ready for the future.

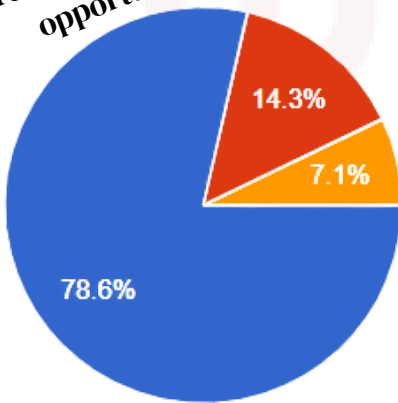

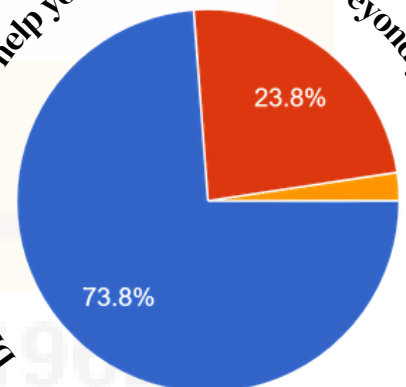

Regular lectures and workshops on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) are also conducted to raise awareness and protect intellectual contributions.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

Lifelong Learning and Extension (LLE)

The college has an active Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension (DLLE), functioning in accordance with the guidelines of the University of Mumbai. The primary objective of DLLE is to sensitise students towards social responsibility while fostering leadership qualities and team spirit. Over the years, the department has successfully undertaken projects such as the Survey of Women



Status (SWS), Population Education Club (PEC), and Career Project (CP), with the participation of over 500 students annually. The department organises a variety of activities, including expert-led sessions under the “A Nation Prepares” series. In addition, peer-to-peer learning sessions are conducted, and students receive professional mentoring for street plays, enabling them to participate in various intercollegiate competitions.

Students earn co-curricular credits upon successful completion of the prescribed DLLE activities. They are also eligible for a grace of up to ten marks, in accordance with the University ordinance.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

“Not Me, But You”



Established in 1982, the NSS unit of the College fosters social responsibility and active citizenship, nurturing leadership, empathy, and civic awareness among students.

NSS volunteers actively contribute through environmental conservation, waste management, community outreach programmes, and regular blood donation drives. The unit conducts cleanliness drives in line with the vision of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and organizes gender sensitization initiatives, including movie screenings and discussions. It has also consistently organized the vibrant socio-cultural intercollegiate fest 'Jagrutva' over the past three years.

Students gain exposure to programmes such as the National Integration Camp (NIC), state-level camps like Utkarsh and Avhan, Youth Parliament, and Independence Day and Republic Day Parade Camps (State/National level). Annual residential camps in adopted villages further offer immersive, hands-on community engagement. With 300 volunteers, each completing at least 120 hours annually, being part of the NSS unit becomes a meaningful journey of learning, growth, and fulfillment.



Outreach Cell

The Outreach Cell of VESASC promotes social responsibility through meaningful collaborations with NGOs and student-led initiatives. During the academic year 2025–26, students actively engaged in programmes that fostered empathy, leadership, and civic awareness.

In collaboration with Pratham NGO, students contributed to the 'Anandi Shanivar' programme, enhancing learning experiences for municipal school children through interactive and multilingual methods. Under 'Project Anubhooti' with Ankur Pratishtan, volunteers conducted activities supporting the holistic development of children at a girls' orphanage. Contributions to the NGO Goonj further extended support to underserved communities.

The Sunday School, a flagship initiative, enabled school dropouts to pursue SSC education with structured academic support. Students also participated in community and environmental initiatives with Shri Satya Sai Seva Organisation and contributed to vocational activities at NASEOH.

Overall, these initiatives reflect VESASC's holistic approach to education, blending academic learning with social commitment to shape responsible and compassionate citizens.

STUDENT WELFARE ACTIVITIES

Women Development Cell (WDC)

The Women Development Cell (WDC) organizes a range of workshops and awareness programmes to empower students and foster a safe, inclusive campus environment. A full-day Life Skills Workshop was conducted to enhance students' decision-making, problem-solving, and coping abilities, while promoting responsible and healthy behavior. An informative session on the POSH Act, 2013 was also held during the last academic year, enabling participants to understand workplace safety, consent, and personal boundaries through interactive discussions and real-life examples.



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Other key initiatives included "Period Positivity," which focused on spreading awareness about menstrual health, dispelling myths, and encouraging the use of sustainable alternatives such as cloth pads and menstrual cups. A Gender Sensitization program was conducted to challenge stereotypes and promote gender equality from an intersectional perspective. Additionally, Anti-Harassment Sessions, workshops on understanding consent in relationships, and Self-Defence training programs were organized to enhance awareness, safety, and confidence among students.

Overall, the WDC is committed to preventing sexual harassment, supporting the well-being of female students and staff, and promoting awareness of gender equality, women's rights, and empowerment.

Career Guidance and Placement Cell

The Career Guidance and Placement Cell (CGPC) of Vivekanand Education Society's College of Arts, Science & Commerce (VESASC), Chembur, actively organized various initiatives during the academic year 2025–26 to enhance student employability and career readiness. A key development was the collaboration with TNS India Foundation for the "Campus to Corporate Careers (C2C) Program," aimed at strengthening placements and soft skills among students.

Several career-oriented activities were conducted throughout the year. An orientation session by the Training and Placement Officer reached 734 final-year students across multiple streams, creating awareness about placement opportunities and skill development.

Institution Innovation Cell (IIC)- Student E-Cell

The Innovation Cell, established in 2022, promotes innovation and entrepreneurship by nurturing an entrepreneurial mindset and encouraging creativity, problem-solving, and risk-taking among students. It supports students in transforming ideas into viable concepts through structured mentoring, training, and guidance, while also preparing them for pitching competitions with the skills and confidence to present before diverse audiences and expert panels.

The Institutional Innovation Cell (IIC) is associated with the H.A.B.I.T. Incubation Center of the VES Trust. The Hashu Advani Business Incubation Technology Foundation fosters a dynamic ecosystem for research-driven innovation and entrepreneurial growth. It supports early-stage startups and student-led ventures through access to funding, technical expertise, and collaborative platforms bridging academia and industry, with a focus on key domains such as Science & Pharmacy, Technology & Engineering, and Architecture & Design. The Innovation Cell further identifies and refines promising student ideas, facilitating their progression as potential incubatees at HABIT, while enabling access to mentorship, technical support, funding opportunities, and greater visibility.



BIS (Bureau of Indian Standards) Club



The BIS Club of the college actively undertakes a range of initiatives aligned with the mission of the Bureau of Indian Standards, fostering awareness of quality and standardization among students. Key activities include quiz competitions on standards and quality practices, PowerPoint presentation sessions on various BIS standards to strengthen conceptual understanding, orientation programs for first-year students, and standard writing competitions aimed at enhancing analytical and technical skills.

These initiatives are conducted through the collaborative efforts of multiple departments, including Microbiology, Biotechnology, Chemistry, Physics, Information Technology, DSDA, and Artificial Intelligence. The interdisciplinary approach reflects the institution's commitment to promoting the principles of quality, safety, and standardization, thereby preparing students for responsible academic and professional engagement.

Counselling Cell

College life can be both exciting and challenging, often facing a variety of challenges. Students may have difficulty adjusting to a new environment, be uncertain about choosing a major or career path, or experience conflict in personal and social relationships. To help students overcome these issues, the college provides the facility of a dedicated counselor. The counselor helps students develop effective coping strategies and work towards achieving their personal and academic goals. All counseling services are confidential and provided free of charge.

Internal Complaint Committee

The Internal Complaint Committee is constituted to Prevent Sexual Harassment at the Workplace. In the Educational Institutions, the IC is formed according to the provisions of the POSH ACT- Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace Act of 2013, (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) and the University Grants Commission (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in higher educational institutions). Regulations. IC at VES aims to promote awareness about sexual harassment in its various forms along with creating a secure physical and social environment. The team organizes programs related to knowing their rights and dealing with harassment. The committee is responsible to address cases related to non-consensual acts of sexual harassment, ensure prompt resolution of complaints and take remedial actions.

Value Lab

The Value Lab of the college was established to instill social, cultural, ethical, financial, and educational values among students. Its initiatives emphasize holistic development, with a strong focus on well-being, stress management, and social responsibility. Through a range of activities, students gain a deeper understanding of stress management, work-life balance, and practices such as meditation for personal growth.

The committee also organizes yoga sessions that promote physical and mental well-being through mindfulness and breathing techniques. Outreach initiatives, including visits to old age homes, help foster empathy, compassion, and emotional awareness. The committee conducts the Gandhi Exam annually to promote ethical values and moral awareness among students.

For faculty members, a Faculty Development Program (FDP) on “Holistic Development and Stress Management” was conducted to encourage a balanced lifestyle and enhance mental well-being. Overall, these initiatives foster self-awareness while strengthening social responsibility and human connection among students and faculty.

Alumni Committee

The VESASC Alumni Association (VESASCAA), registered in 2017, fosters strong engagement between alumni and the institution, contributing to student development and academic enrichment. It collaborates with departments to organize initiatives that bridge the gap between academic learning and industry expectations. Alumni actively participate as resource persons in career guidance sessions, higher education talks, and industry-oriented workshops, offering valuable professional insights.

Employability-focused activities such as resume-building sessions, mock interviews, and ‘Campus to Corporate’ interactions help students prepare for professional careers. The association supports academic and co-curricular activities through expert lectures, seminars, competitions, alumni talks, panel discussions, and mentorship initiatives.

It has instituted Distinguished Alumni Awards and Alumni Recognition Awards to honour alumni achievements, inspire excellence, and encourage them to contribute their expertise for mentoring students and supporting institutional growth. The association also demonstrates commitment to student welfare through financial assistance and scholarships for deserving students. Through sustained engagement and meaningful contributions, VESASCAA strengthens alumni relations while enriching the overall student experience.

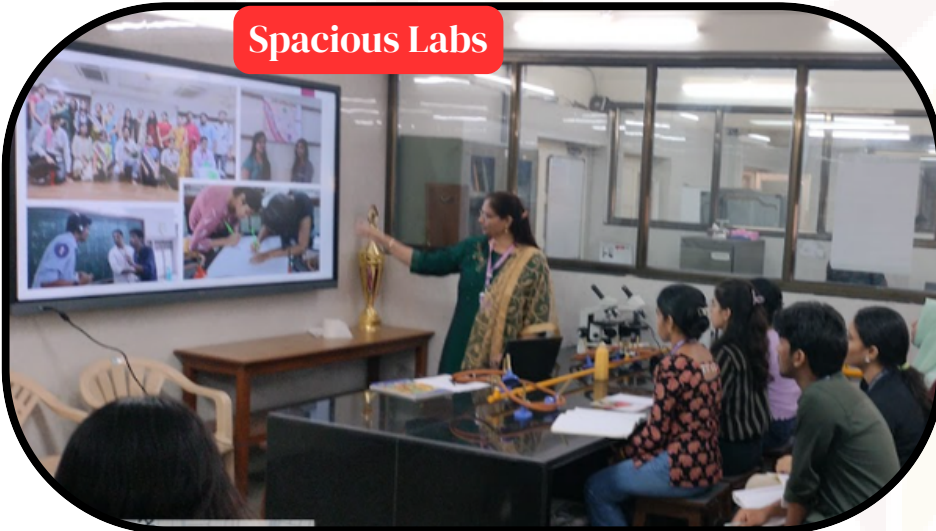
The placement activities recorded a total of 123 requirements shared by companies. Overall, 269 students have been placed so far, with 144 placements through TNS India Foundation and 125 through the CGPC. The highest salary package offered during the year was 5 LPA.

PM-USHA Grant Initiative - Transforming Infrastructure, Innovation and Institutional Excellence

In 2024, the College was awarded a prestigious grant under the PM-USHA scheme, aimed at strengthening institutional infrastructure, enhancing academic capabilities, and promoting holistic student development. The grant has been strategically utilized for new construction, renovation and modernization of facilities, procurement of advanced equipment, and implementation of a range of academic and capacity-building (soft component) initiatives.

Over the past two years, the College has made significant progress in transforming its physical and academic landscape.

Infrastructure Development

A major highlight under the construction component is the development of a modern Basketball Court, designed to promote sports excellence and multi-purpose use. The project is nearing completion and will serve as an important facility for training, inter-collegiate competitions, and student recreation.

In addition, the College has installed an Outdoor Calisthenics Rig to promote functional fitness and encourage a culture of physical well-being among students.

Renovation and Modernization

- Modernization of the Library and implementation of Library Automation through RFID technology for issue, submission, and inventory management, significantly improving efficiency and user experience.

The college has developed a multipurpose basketball court, and the setting up of a gym is currently in progress. 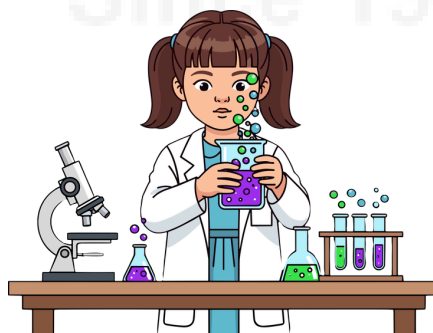

 1. Attested copy of "AADHAR CARD"
 2. Attested copy of the caste certificate in the name of the student issued by Maharashtra State only, and that caste should be listed in the Maharashtra State list.
 3. Attested copy of Domicile Certificate.
 4. Attested copy of Income certificate of Parents.
 5. Attested copy of the Ration card (first & last page only)
 6. Attested copy of Marksheet
 7. Students are required to open savings account in their name in Nationalised Bank of India with Aadhar Card linked & submit the photocopy of the passbook at the college office counter.

Rules: -

- A) i) Students belonging to SC & ST whose parents' gross income is less than & equal to Rs. 2,50,000/- p.a. are eligible to apply for Post SSC Scholarship. (Income Certificate certified by the Tahsildar Office has to be submitted at the College office counter)
- ii) Students belonging to DT, NT, OBC and SBC whose parent's gross income is less than & equal to Rs. 1,50,000/- p.a. are eligible to apply for the Post SSC Scholarship (Income Certificate certified by the Tahsiladar Office has to be submitted at the college office counter)

B) i) Students belonging to SC & ST whose parents' gross income is above Rs. 2,50,000/-p.a. are eligible for Freeship. (Income Certificate certified by the Tahisladar office has to be submitted at the college office counter)

ii) Students belonging to DT, NT, OBC and SBC whose parent's gross income is less than & equal to Rs. 8,00,000/- p.a. are eligible to apply for Freeship. (Income Certificate certified by the Tahsildar Office along the non-creamy layer certificate has to be submitted at the College office counter)

C) The above income certificate has to be certified by Tahsildar to get the benefit of the Scholarship including the Government employees and pensioners for the first year. Once sanctioned, the income certificate by the Tahsildar is valid for the next two years.

D) Students belonging to other than above specified income group are eligible to apply for Government of India Post SSC Freeship.

E) If the Third Child is a male, then he will not be eligible to get the OBC, SBC, & VJNT.

F) SC, ST, DT, NT, OBC, and SBC students are required to submit the Income Certificate of the previous year obtained from the Tehsildar office along with a non-creamy layer certificate. Student who have already got the benefit above mentioned Freeship are not required to renew their non-creamy layer certificate.

G) The repeater will not get the benefit of any scholarship or Freeship for the class.

Private Scholarships

A. PM Vidyalaxmi Scheme

Students of our college are eligible for scholarships given by Vivekanand Education Society as well as some from private trusts and donors. Here are a list of private scholarships that can be availed by the students of Vivekanand Education Society's College of Arts, Science and Commerce.

B. V.E.S. Samarthan

Applicable to any student studying in Vivekanand Society's school and colleges. Therefore, students from any stream can avail this scholarship. Students getting any other financial assistance, grants or free ships from any Government or semi – Government agencies, are not eligible. No financial assistance will be granted to a student who has failed in any class. Financial assistance amount will be paid directly to the educational institution. Grant of the requested assistance or any part thereof is at the discretion of the management. Continuation of the Financial assistance or any part thereof in subsequent years will depend upon the successful completion of the course during the preceding year with a qualifying percentage and shall also be at the discretion of the management.

C. Nihchal Israni Foundation

We are extremely grateful to the Nihchal Israni Foundation for extending financial assistance to meritorious and deserving students of VES Arts, Science and Commerce. During the academic year 2021-22 45 students were given the scholarship of Rs 10,000 each. This Scholarship is provided to the students of Vivekanand Education Society's College of Arts, Science & Commerce. Since 2015 and still continuing. They provide scholarship to 45 students in total, 15 students each from First year, Second Year and Third Year. The scholarship is provided based on their Academic Performance and their Interview.

D. Suresh Chand Jain Scholarship

During the academic year 2023-24, a new scholarship for extending financial assistance to meritorious and deserving science undergraduate students is instituted. The scholarship of Rs. 5000/- each will be given to 5 students every year. The scholarship will be based on the academic performance and the interview of the students. The scholarship will be awarded on the 8th day of January every year.

3. Copy of the income statement should be submitted by the student.
4. Students who have secured more than 65% in the previous academic year need to submit the copy of the same.
5. ATKT and repeater students are not eligible for this scholarship.
6. 2 scholarships will be reserved for Biotechnology/Microbiology students. If there aren't any eligible students in the Biotechnology stream then these too will be open for all science undergraduate students.

Examinations – Important Norms/Guidelines under Autonomy

The College has been granted Autonomous Status by University Grants Commission (UGC) for a period of Ten Years w.e.f. 2020-2021 to 2030-2031 (Letter No. F. 22 1/2017(AC) dated 7th Sept, 2021) and further has received conferment by the University of Mumbai vide its letter Aff. /ICD/21-22/1101. However, the college will remain affiliated to University of Mumbai with an autonomous status.

IMPORTANT POLICIES OF COLLEGE:

- 1. ATTENDANCE-** Every bonafide learner (student) shall ordinarily be allowed to keep terms for the given semester in a program of his enrolment, only if he fulfills at least seventy five percent (75%) of the attendance taken as an average of the total number of lectures, practicals, tutorials etc. wherein short and/or long excursions/field visits/study tours organized by the college and supervised by the teachers as envisaged in the syllabus shall be credited to his attendance for the total number of periods which are otherwise delivered on the material day/s. Further it is mandatory for every learner to have a minimum of 50% attendance for each course & average attendance has to be 75%. [As per the revised O.6086 brought into effect from 2014-15, via University Circular No. UG/01 of 2014 dated 5th May 2014]
- 2. Students must carry their College Student ID card and the Hall ticket (if applicable), to the Examination hall for Semester End examinations**
- 3. All students must abide by the general rules and guidelines for appearing for examinations which are available on college websites.**
- 4. Students with any Learning Disability (LD), namely, Dyslexia, Dysgraphia & Dyscalculia or are visually impaired /low vision/physically challenged are requested to contact the college office to obtain details about the facilities available to them for examinations viz. Extra time and writer. They are required to produce the relevant documents to avail the benefits of appearing for the examinations by providing appropriate documentation of her/his disability to qualify for modifications, one month in advance before the start of the examinations to the Principal.**

A) ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION PATTERN

The performance of each learner will be evaluated in two components.

- For UG & PG programs [NEP 2020] - Internal: Total marks 40, Semester End Examinations: Total marks 60. Individual passing in both internal and Semester End Examinations is a must. Passing percentage is 40%.
- Internal exams would include a minimum of two academic activities and attendance.
- There would be no internal exams for Practical Papers.

Passing Standard

- Passing in each individual head is a minimum of 40% (Independently in Semester End Examinations and Internal).
- Overall grades would be given by combining marks of Semester End Examinations and Internal exams marks in aggregate for each course.

C) RULE 0.299 (ADDITIONAL GRACE MARKS)

1. Candidates shall be eligible for the award of maximum 10 grace marks, wherever necessary in addition to the mark secured in each head of passing for participation in any one of the activities like Sports, NCC, NSS, DLLLE.
2. Additional provisions for gracing as made to Ordinances 5042A, 5043A, 5044A, 5045A and 5046 A in view of the Grading and Credit System will be followed as it is.

D) REGULATION 8917 (CONDUCT OF ADDITIONAL EXAM)

As per R. 8917, a learner who does not appear in some or all the courses on medical grounds or for representing the college/ University in Sports, cultural activities, activities of NSS, NCC or Sports training camps or for any other reason which is considered valid under exceptional circumstances and to the satisfaction of the Principal or Head of the institution is eligible to appear for additional examination. The absent learner will be allowed to appear for the examination by the head of the institution after following the necessary formalities subject to the reasons to the satisfaction of the head of the institution.

E) PHOTOCOPYING & REVALUATION

The examinee can independently apply for Revaluation or photocopy or both simultaneously, if he/she desires so. The Examinee who desires to apply for revaluation are requested to note that, his / her original marks will become null & void as soon as he submits his application for the revaluation within prescribed time limit. The revaluation facility shall be for all the papers where write answer script is available conducted by the College for the respective current session.

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G) NORMS FOR ALLOWED TO KEEP TERMS (ATKT):

ALLOWED TO KEEP TERMS (ATKT) RULES UNDER NEP FOR VESASC (AUTONOMOUS) APPLICABLE FOR ARTS/ SCIENCE/ COMMERCE- AIDED/ SFC/ AUTONOMOUS

Implementation of the ATKT Rules for Progression in Undergraduate (UG) and Post-Graduate (PG) programs (2025-26 onwards)

***R-I: Carry forward of marks in case of a learner who fails in the internal assessment and/or semester-end assessment in one or more subjects.**

1. For a learner who passes the internal exam but fails in the semester-end examination: A learner who passes in the internal examination but fails in the semester-end examination of the course shall reappear for the semester-end examination of that course. However, his/her marks of the internal examination shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled to the grade obtained by him/her on passing.

2. For a learner who passes the semester-end examination but fails in the internal assessment: A learner who passes in the semester-end examination but fails in the internal assessment of the course shall reappear for the Internal examination of that course. However, his/her marks of the Semester End Examination shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled to the grade obtained by him/her on passing.

***R-II: Rules for Progression (Allowed to keep terms-ATKT)**

UG programs:

1. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester II irrespective of the number of courses of failure in Semester I.

2. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester III if he/she scores 32 or more Cumulative credits from Semester I & Semester II out of 44 credits.

3. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester IV irrespective of the number of courses of failure in Semester III.

4. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester V if he/she scores 76 or more Cumulative credits from Semester I, II, III & IV.

5. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester VI irrespective of the number of courses of failure in Semester V.

6. The result of Semester VI shall be withheld by the College till the student passes all the Semesters from Semester I to Semester VI.

7. A learner admitted under NEP must earn all his/her credits of each semester to pass within a period of seven academic years (beginning from the academic year of his/her admission) to be eligible for an undergraduate degree.

8. For 4th year Honor's Program / PG Program (Level 6)

The result of PG Semester IV shall be kept in abeyance until the learner passes each of PG Semester I, Semester II, and Semester III.

H) UNFAIR MEANS ADOPTED DURING EXAMINATIONS:

A student observed using unfair means will have to depose before the Unfair Means Committee constituted by the College. The committee, after talking to the student and reviewing the case will recommend a course of action to the Principal.

The quantum of punishment shall vary from annulment of the performance of the student during exams in full, (internal test, semester theory & practicals) to debarring the students from appearing in any future exams.

The minimum punishment, therefore, is cancellation of the entire examination and debarring the student from one more attempt of the same examination.

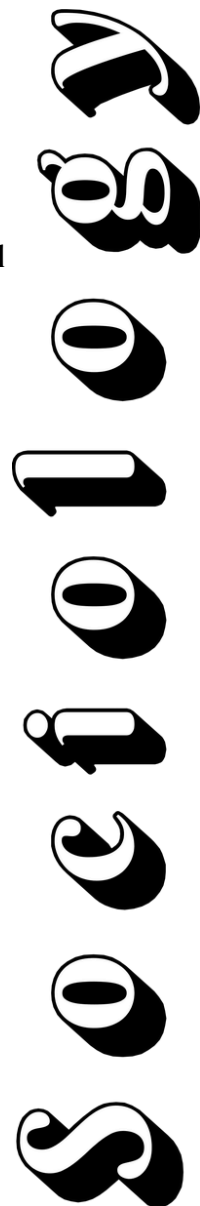

II) Medium of Instruction: Our College is an English Medium College, hence the instructions in all the subjects are imparted through the English language only. Students must write their examinations in English only.

III) Arrangement of Terms: Reopening/ First Term - The First Term will start on 13th June, 2026. Second Term & Exact schedule will be notified later.

IV) College Timings: The first lecture starts at 7.30 am, and the last lecture typically ends at 5.20 pm. The students might have different timetables depending on their courses. The college office is open from 10 am to 5 pm every day.

V) Holidays: The college will remain closed on Sundays and all public holidays as declared by the Government of Maharashtra and on such other days as the Management declares from time to time.

VI) Granting of Terms: The college will grant terms on the basis of (a) 75% attendance in lectures and in Practicals separately in each term/each subject. (b) Good conduct.

According to University rules, attendance at lectures, practicals, and tutorials is compulsory. The minimum attendance required for granting the term is three fourth of the days on which lectures, Practicals and tutorials are conducted. (Ordinance 0.6086). Attendance will be condoned on medical grounds by 10% (A student must keep a minimum 65% attendance) provided it is substantiated by relevant medical certificate within a week of getting the fitness certificate. Parents/ Guardians are requested to check their ward's attendance from the college regularly.

VII] ATKT Examination: Candidates who have been declared failed in the examinations and/or are allowed to keep terms (ATKT) for the higher class shall be required to appear for the ATKT examinations conducted by the college. The ATKT examinations are generally conducted after the declaration of the respective semester results. Details regarding the ATKT Examination schedule, application procedure, and payment of fees will be notified by the college from time to time and will also be made available on the college website. Student must fill in and submit the ATKT examination form within the stipulated time in order to be eligible to appear for the ATKT examination.

VIII] Railway Concession: All students are eligible to avail concession for railway journeys between the stations near to the place of their residence in Mumbai and the college, and for journeys between their place of permanent residence (where the students or his parents normally reside as declared in their application form for admission) and Mumbai during vacations. - All the members of the Students Council shall help the Principal in the maintenance of the order and discipline among the students in general and at the time of college functions in particular, and they shall not use their position to be irregular in attending lectures, practicals or any other way harming the interest of the institution.

X) Identity Card: No duplicate Identity Card will ordinarily be issued. The loss of Identity card should be immediately reported to the Principal, Vice Principal along with a detailed written explanation of the circumstance in which the Identity card was lost. The report of the loss of Identity card should be reinforced with a police complaint made to the nearest police station. The Principal may issue an Identity card after considering the propriety of the concerned student. Serious disciplinary action will be taken against students for misusing the Identity Card. The students will be charged Rs. 500/-for duplicate Id Card.

XI) College Discipline: The institution attaches utmost importance to discipline and character building. Therefore, the following rules must be followed by the students:

- The College premises are under 24 hours Electronic Surveillance.
- Students shall not be allowed to enter the college premises without showing the valid Identity Card. Penalty for not wearing the Identity Card is Rs. 100/-
- Students shall attend all classes, tutorials, seminars, practical and college examinations according to the time-table. Students remaining absent shall submit a leave note signed by their parents/ guardians stating reasons for their absenteeism. Absenteeism on medical grounds should be supported by a medical certificate. In all cases, absenteeism over three days should be immediately brought to the notice of the authority .
- Students will not go for a job, or work or business or private coaching during the college hours. If anyone misses the lectures/practicals for that reason, his/her admission is liable to be canceled immediately.
- Students shall not bring with them unauthorized persons into the college premises.
- Students shall take proper care of all college property. Any damage done to the property of the college by disfiguring walls, rooms, windows and fittings or breaking the furniture and such things is a breach of discipline and will be punishable. As such damage done to the college property will have to be made good by the concerned class students.
- The Students should come decently dressed to the college. Informal dresses will not be permitted in the college premises. Boys-Full Pant/jeans with shirt/T-shirt with sleeves. Boys should cut their hair short. Girls-Salwar Kameez/ or jeans pants/long skirts with tops/T-shirts with sleeves. For violation of dress code there will be a penalty of Rs. 100/-
- Associations/Organizations will be formed only after the prior permission of the Principal.
- Collecting funds for any purpose is strictly prohibited unless scrutinized and permitted by the Principal.
- SMOKING IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED in the college premises.
- The college has an anti-ragging cell. Any incidents of ragging or harassment of a student by another student must be reported and will be dealt with very strictly.
- The loss of mark-sheet should be immediately reported to the Principal/Vice Principal along with a detailed written explanation of the circumstances in which the mark-sheet was lost. The report of the loss of mark-sheet should be reinforced with a police complaint made to the nearest police station and an affidavit (on a Rs.50/- Stamp paper) specifying details. The Principal may issue a duplicate mark-sheet after considering the propriety of the concerned student. Serious disciplinary action will be taken against students for misusing the mark-sheet. The students will be charged Rs.100/-for duplicate mark-sheet.

IC at VESASC aims to promote awareness about sexual harassment in its various forms along with creating a secure physical and social environment. The team organizes programs related to knowing their rights and dealing with harassment. The committee is responsible to address cases related to non-consensual acts of sexual harassment, ensure prompt resolution of complaints and take remedial actions.

C) Women Development Cell : (In charge – Dr. Radhika Mohan)

Gender sensitization and gender justice are the pillars of educational institutions. We at VESAS College aim to create a gender sensitive campus and bring in policies of women empowerment. As per the guidelines suggested by Mumbai University, our college addresses concerns of gender discrimination and recommend measures and policies for gender parity at campus. This event is followed by the grand celebration of the College Annual Day . Students who excel in various competitions receive certificates and prizes in recognition of their achievements. (c) **Shri Hashuji Advani State Level Memorial Elocution Competition:** College conducts Shri Hashu Ji Advani Memorial Elocution Competition, which has successfully captivated the hearts and minds of participants for the past four years. This esteemed state-level

competition aims to provide a vibrant platform for the youth of Maharashtra to express their opinions, share their perspectives, and engage in meaningful discourse.

This event embodies the vision of Shri Hashuji Advani, the founder of our college, by promoting holistic educational development. It encourages students to cultivate critical thinking, enhance their public speaking skills, and foster self-confidence. Over the years, we have reached various districts across Maharashtra, including Mumbai, Thane, Dharashiv, Pune, Nagpur, Raigad, Sindhudurg, Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar, Palghar, and beyond, receiving enthusiastic participation from a diverse array of regions.

(d) **VESCON** : College organizes VESCON an intercollegiate event with the aim of honing the academic skills of the students in an innovative way through Competitions, workshops, games and activities that not only induce a healthy competitive spirit with other college peers, but also make them market-ready with skills beyond the textbooks. The winning students get certificates and cash prizes.
